Legislation title: Authorize the City Attorney to appear Amicus Curiae in Support of Clarifying Oregon's Owner Consent Law to Retain Designated Historic Resources. (Resolution)

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

There is no proposed City legislation. The resolution allows the City an opportunity to convince the Oregon Supreme Court to interpret existing State legislation consistently with existing City policy.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

There are no measurable financial or budgetary impacts. A two-paged petition will be prepared by the City Attorney. The City Attorney will join in a brief largely prepared by other friends of the court.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Supreme Court reversal of a recent Court of Appeals decision could help avoid the delisting of up to 17,770 historic properties in Portland.

The Historic Landmarks Commission was briefed in a public meeting on May 12, 2015 and supports the resolution.

A 28 day court filing deadline prevents more extensive community outreach.
