

Ordinance No. 31415.

An Ordinance prohibiting any person from talking to or conversing with any motorman operating a street railway car or interurban railway car in the City of Portland.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to talk to or to engage in conversation with any motorman operating any street railway car or interurban railway car in the City of Portland, or for any such motorman to talk to or engage in conversation with any other person: Provided, however, that nothing contained in this section shall be construed to prevent a direction by a passenger to a motorman to stop the car at a given point, or the necessary conversation of the motorman operating such car with other persons employed in the operation thereof, or in the operation of the street railway or interurban railway to which such car belongs.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to run or operate, or cause to be operated or run, any street railway car or interurban railway car in any street in the City of Portland unless there shall be displayed or placed over the station in such car occupied by the motorman thereof, a sign to the effect that conversation with the motorman is prohibited by law.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court, be punished by a fine not ex-

ceeding \$100, or by imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding 50 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
