ORDINANCE No. 187252

* Apply to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services for a grant in the amount of \$375,000 for the 2015 COPS Hiring Program grant to fund three School Resource Officers for three years (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The COPS Hiring Program (CHP) provides funding directly to law enforcement agencies to hire career law enforcement officers in an effort to increase their community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts.
- 2. The COPS Office anticipates making approximately 200 CHP awards for a total of approximately \$134.5 million.
- 3. Due to the reduction of four FTE in FY 2013-14, the Youth Services Division has been unable to provide five day a week coverage for Portland area schools.
- 4. The City of Portland, Oregon Police Bureau wishes to apply for 2015 CHP grant money to fund three additional officers to act as School Resource Officers in Portland Public Schools.
- 5. The COPS office may reimburse the City a maximum of \$375,000 over three years for salary and benefits expenses incurred for the three additional FTE officer positions.
- 6. Local match in the amount of \$452,596 will be provided by funds from the bureau's General Fund budget appropriations.
- 7. The grant period is three years for each position awarded.
- 8. If awarded, the City agrees to retain each added officer position for at least 12 months following the conclusion of three years of grant funding for that position.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to USDOJ COPS for a grant in the amount of \$375,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because of critical deadlines in the grant application process. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
