

Ordinance No. 33071

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to purchase the North one-half of Lot 1, Block 30, Woodstock, as a site for a fire station, authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to draw a warrant to provide for the payment of said property, repealing Ordinance No. 33071, passed by the Council September 1, 1916, Ordinance No. 33145, passed by the Council September 30, 1916, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to purchase the North one-half of Lot one (1), Block thirty (30) Woodstock, City of Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon, as a site for a fire station, at a price not exceeding \$600.00.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to draw a warrant on the General Fund, chargeable to the appropriation for the purchase of real estate for the Bureau of Fire, in the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00), in favor of Andrew Petris, to provide for the purchase of the North one-half of Lot one (1), Block thirty (30), Woodstock, as a site for a fire station, said warrant to be delivered upon the filing by said Andrew Petris of an abstract of title to said property properly certified to by the City Attorney and the execution of a proper deed to the City providing for the sale of said lot to the City.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 33071 entitled, "An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to purchase lot 1, block 30, Woodstock as a site for a fire station, authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to draw a warrant to provide for the payment of said property, and declaring an emergency", passed by the Council September 1, 1916, and Ordinance No. 33145 entitled, "An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to purchase lot 1, block 30, Woodstock, as a site for a fire station, authorizing the Mayor and Auditor to draw a warrant to provide for the payment of said property, repealing Ordinance No. 33071, passed by the Council September 1, 1916, and declaring an emergency", passed by the Council September 30, 1916, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: The City has received a satisfactory offer from the owner of said property for its purchase and use as a site for a fire station and it is desirable that the transaction for the sale of said lot to the City be consummated at the earliest possible date; therefore an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

The City of Portland Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to purchase the North one-half of Lot one (1), Block thirty (30), Woodstock, City of Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon, as a site for a fire station, at a price not exceeding \$500.00.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Auditor be and they are hereby authorized to draw a warrant on the General Fund, chargeable to the appropriation for the purchase of real estate for the Bureau of Fire, in the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) in favor of Andrew Petris, to provide for the purchase of the North one-half of Lot one (1), Block thirty (30), Woodstock, as a site for a fire station, said warrant to be delivered upon the filing by said Andrew Petris of an abstract of title to said property properly certified to by the City Attorney and the execution of a proper deed to the City providing for the sale of said lot to the City.

Section 3. Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: The City has received a satisfactory offer from the owner of said property for its purchase and use as a site for a fire station and it is desirable that the transaction for the sale of said lot to the City be consummated at the earliest possible date; therefore an emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
