

ORDINANCE No. 187301

Authorize a \$5,000 Intergovernmental Agreement with Washington County for the administration of the Master Recycler Program. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. City Council adopted Resolution No. 36423 which established the following goals for the solid waste and recycling system:
 - Zero growth in the waste stream.
 - Increase the recycling rate to 75 percent by 2015.
 - Make the whole system more sustainable.
 - Reduce toxics and greenhouse gases.
2. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability direct City elected officials and staff to “prevent additional pollution through planned proactive measures. . . ,” to “act locally to reduce adverse global impacts... and support and implement innovative programs that maintain and promote Portland’s leadership as a sustainable city” and to “educate citizens and businesses... and encourage everyone to take responsibility for their actions that otherwise adversely impact the environment.”
3. On July 1, 2003, the City of Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability acquired management of the Master Recycler Program, previously an OSU Extension program.
4. The Master Recycler Program provides education and outreach to participants to increase public awareness of and activities in waste prevention and recycling. The program provides a nine-week training course for adults on the solid waste and recycling system. Participants “pay back” their training by educating others in the community—either by doing special projects or interacting with the public at events--multiplying the program efforts. The program is funded by Metro, the City of Portland, Clackamas and Washington Counties and supports the Metro region.
5. During the 2014-2015 FY, 62 people completed the Master Recycler Program training and Master Recycler volunteers contributed almost 3500 hours of waste reduction education and outreach in the Portland Metro area.
6. Metro, Washington County, Clackamas County, and the City of Portland have indicated a willingness to contribute funding to a region-wide Master Recycler Program to provide high-quality trainings to residents throughout the Portland metro region.


NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland additional funding from Washington County in the amount of \$5,000 for the implementation of the Master Recycler Program from July 1, 2015 to June 2016 and subsequent renewal every year, and to execute an agreement with Washington County in a form substantially similar to Exhibit 1.
- b. The Mayor is further authorized to accept up to \$500 to cover up to ten (10) \$50 scholarships awarded to residents in Washington County.
- c. The funding for 2015-16 is included in the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability FY 2015-16 Requested Budget.
- d. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- e. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications for the Master Recycler Program grant, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by ordinance adopted by the Portland City Council.

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
