## Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This ordinance will amend an existing City contract for ADA Title II barrier assessment in public facilities to perform this work at the City-owned Portland'5 Centers for the Arts facilities. Although the performing arts facilities were not included in the original scope of work, as City-owned facilities, the City has a responsibility to include them in ADA Title II Transition planning efforts. Amending this existing contract to include the performing arts facilities will provide consistent information across the entire portfolio of City properties.

This is the 4<sup>th</sup> amendment to Contract No. 30002636.

### Financial and budgetary impacts:

Funding for the work to be performed under this contract is included in the FY 15-16 Spectator Venues and Visitor Activities Fund Budget.

The work performed under this contract amendment will identify accessibility barriers in the three performance venue facilities owned by the City and operated by Portland'5 Centers for the Arts. The inventory and prioritization of barriers in the facilities will allow the Spectator Venues program and Portland'5 to collaborate on a multi-year program to address them.

#### Community impacts and community involvement:

The work performed under this contract amendment will identify barriers to access at the Portland'5 Centers for the Arts Venues. These five venues in three buildings have an annual attendance of over 730,000 people at a wide range of performances. Following the work covered by this contract amendment, public comment will be sought on prioritizing the identified barriers and a multi-year program to address them will be developed. Ultimately the community will benefit from improved access for people with disabilities to the facilities.
