## ORDINANCE No. 187330

\* Amend grant agreements for navigator services at the Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services for a combined annual amount of \$248,200 (Ordinance; amend contracts Nos. 32000977; 32000976; 32000979; 32000998; 32000375; and 32000391)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On October 21, 2009, the City Council, through Portland City Ordinance no. 183257, entered into an intergovernmental agreement with Multnomah County, Oregon (County) to jointly operate a One Stop Center for Domestic Violence (County Contract no.30000956). The Center is now known as the Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services ("the Center").
- 2. A request for proposals for grant funding to provide "navigator" (advocacy) services was circulated amongst community-based domestic violence service providers on April 15, 2010.
- 3. Six non-profit corporations (The YWCA of Greater Portland ("YWCA"), the Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization ("IRCO"), Ecumenical Ministries Russian Oregon Social Services ("EMO"), Bradley Angle ("BA"), the Native American Youth Association (NAYA), and Catholic Charities El Programma Hispano "El Programma"), (collectively the "Grantees") sought grant funding to provide the navigator services at the Center. There were no other responses to the request for proposals.
- 4. Portland City Council authorized grant agreements with the six Grantees after the Grantees were selected for grant awards through ordinance Nos. 183785; 183792; 183786; 183791; 183787; and 183784. The resulting grant agreements were executed on or about June 1, 2010. The original grant agreements all had the term of June 1, 2010 to May 31, 2013.
- 5. Council has authorized amendments to the grant agreements extending the terms to June 30, 2015, as well as providing small increases in funding through ordinances Nos 185323; 186683 (El Programma); 185321; 186682 (YWCA); 186120 (BA); 186121 (IRCO); 186122 (EMO); and 186123 (NAYA).
- 6. All the Grantees have provided excellent services pursuant to the grant agreements, and continued to provide their services since June 30, 2015. The Grantees wish to and are able to continue to provide navigation services at the Center.
- 7. The grant agreements should be retroactively extended from July 1, 2015. The Center has operational funds to pay navigator services from July 1, 2015 until June 30, 2017.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to sign the grant amendments with the Grantees in substantial conformance with the ones attached as Exhibit A and approved as to form by the City Attorney.
- b. The grant funding for the additional navigator services will be from the Center's ongoing operations budget. \$496,400.00 will be dispersed to fund services through June 30, 2017.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the contract; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by council.
