28-year old innocent Negro worker sentenced to hang in Oregon State Penitentiary is victim of a legal lynching?

Look At These Facts About His Trial

1. No Negroes served on the jury.
2. Unable to engage a lawyer, court appointed one the eleventh hour.
3. Few witnesses were brought for him.
4. Jordan forced to testify against himself.
5. Jordan forced to introduce confession obtained by tortures.
6. Jordan was convicted on perjured testimony of a felon and a drug-addict.
7. His confession broadcast over Station KFJI.
8. Next morning, a mob clamored for a lynching.
9. The widow of the deceased sat in the court.
10. Her daughter sat in the jurors' laps.
