## ORDINANCE No. 187439

\* Authorize application to the Rockefeller Foundation for a grant to hire a Chief Resilience Officer, develop and implement a citywide resilience plan, and become a member of the 100 Resilient Cities Network. (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The majority of people on the planet now live in cities, creating new vulnerabilities to health and economic well-being, as well as greater pressures for urban planning and governance.
- 2. The City of Portland in particular faces challenges related to affordable housing, homelessness, aging infrastructure, earthquake, flooding, landslide, and other risks.
- 3. Cities are also centers of opportunity and innovation. Portland is a leader among American cities in its planning for climate adaptation, bicycle transportation, green infrastructure, community engagement, and other innovations.
- 4. To enable cities like Portland to build on their strengths and increase their resilience in the face of increasing social, economic, and physical challenges, the Rockefeller Foundation has launched the 100 Resilient Cities Centennial Challenge.
- 5. The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management is seeking membership in 100 Resilient Cities Network as part of a strategic effort to increase citywide resilience.
- 6. If selected for membership, the City would receive technical and financial support to hire a Chief Resilience Officer, develop a citywide resilience strategy and become a participating member of the 100 Resilient Cities Network.
- 7. No match is required by this grant.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Rockefeller Foundation for a grant to hire a Chief Resilience Officer, develop and implement a citywide resilience plan, and become a member of the 100 Resilient Cities Network.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.

c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in the application for this grant could result in losing the opportunity for an award. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effective from and after its passage by Council.
