ORDINANCE NO. 187443

* Authorize a grant agreement with the Rosewood Initiative in the amount of \$30,000 to support a community safety pilot program. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Rosewood community, straddling the border of Gresham and Portland, is one of dense poverty and incredible diversity.
- 2. Rosewood Initiative is a non-profit organization operating in the Rosewood Neighborhood that provides services supporting residents and businesses.
- 3. The Community Safety Program is a pilot program of the Rosewood Initiative to provide a public space for the neighborhood to form an identity and become empowered to advocate for itself.
- 4. The purpose of the Rosewood Initiative Community Safety Program is to create and maintain a safer and heathier community by addressing the community safety issues which currently exist in this neighborhood.
- 5. Multnomah County, the City of Gresham, and the City of Portland are investing in the safety of the Rosewood neighborhood and funding collaboration between jurisdictions.
- 6. The City Council appropriated \$30,000 in one-time funding in the FY 2015-16 Adopted Budget for the Community Safety Program.
- 7. It is beneficial to the City and community that this agreement may be authorized as quickly as possible to avoid delay in funding the program.
- 8. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04 Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. Since the Rosewood Initiative was a specific line item requested by the Council in the 2015-16 Adopted Budget, a competitive application process was not implemented for this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. That the Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute an agreement between the City and the Rosewood Initiative as outlined in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000.
- b. The Chief of Police and the Grant Manager are authorized to execute amendments to the scope of services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the amount of compensation or increase the City's financial risk.

- c. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04 Budget.
- d. The Mayor and the Auditor are hereby authorized to provide payment as provided under the Grant Agreement, chargeable to the applicable budgets when demand is presented and approved by the appropriate authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the funding goes towards the salary costs of the Director of Community Safety and other program costs that are currently being expensed. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
