

## ORDINANCE No. 187457

\*Authorize a grant agreement with Portland YouthBuilders, to support outreach, workforce training and hiring efforts in East Portland neighborhoods that surround the Beech and Gateway Park project sites for a not-to-exceed grant amount of \$41,250 (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that:

1. The City of Portland Procurement Services collects funds through its compliance-related activities to provide grant opportunities to organizations that provide recruitment and training for women, minority and student pre-apprentices to enter the construction trades. During earlier discussions with the community, the City demonstrated its commitment to East Portland neighborhoods by agreeing to set aside direct funding to support outreach, workforce training and hiring efforts in East Portland neighborhoods that surround the Beech and Gateway Park project sites. Portland Parks and Recreation (PP&R)'s use of this funding will be in alignment with the CBP focus for the construction of the Beech and Gateway Parks to benefit the surrounding community.
2. The City of Portland Procurement Services and PP&R will utilize 0.375% of the hard construction costs for Beech and Gateway Parks (\$41,250) to fund this grant. The grant will assist disadvantaged and minority youth populations in East Portland by providing outreach, workforce training and hiring efforts to help them create pathways out of poverty and generate self-sufficiency. Efforts will target East Portland zip codes that surround the project sites (those identified in City of Portland Procurement Services and PP&R's June 2015 Request for Proposals [RFP] for outreach, training, recruitment efforts and technical assistance: 97266, 97233, 97220, 97216 and 97230).
3. Portland YouthBuilders (PYB) is a high school accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NAC) serving very low income young people between 17 and 24 who face multiple barriers to academic achievement and career success. PYB offers a multi-year program of education, vocational training, community services, and long term support to approximately 200 youth each year.
4. The City of Portland's future economic and social well-being are dependent upon more students graduating from high school, pursuing further education, and securing career-ladder employment. The work of PYB includes providing high school completion, construction training opportunities, career exploration and support services, preparing youth for entry into the workforce. The construction program is an Oregon Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) registered pre-apprenticeship program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:


- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute a Grant Agreement with Portland YouthBuilders subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney's office at a cost not to exceed \$41,250.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in proceeding with this effort will result in a delay in the implementation of the workforce training and hiring as it pertains to the Beech and Gateway Parks projects; this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
