Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The City, TriMet and the City of Beaverton wish to enter into a new Agreement to provide policing services for the TriMet transit system effective September 29, 2015 through June 30, 2020. It is the intent of this agreement to continue assignment of one or more City of Beaverton Police Officers to Transit Police. Transit Police is managed by the Portland Police Bureau, and staffed by officers from several jurisdictions. The City of Beaverton will pay the salaries, overtime, insurance, retirement and other benefits and indirect (overhead) charges. The City of Beaverton will invoice TriMet for services provided by the City of Beaverton. Future staffing levels may be adjusted by agreement of the City of Portland, the City of Beaverton and TriMet under the authority of the commander of the Transit Police Division.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This legislation will not generate or reduce current of future revenue coming to the City. There is no cost to the City as TriMet will reimburse the City of Beaverton directly for all related expenses of its officers that are assigned to the Transit Police Division.

The community will benefit from the continuation of system-wide and multi-jurisdictional coordination of public safety services that the Transit Police Division provides
