Subject: Skidmore Historic Design Guidelines

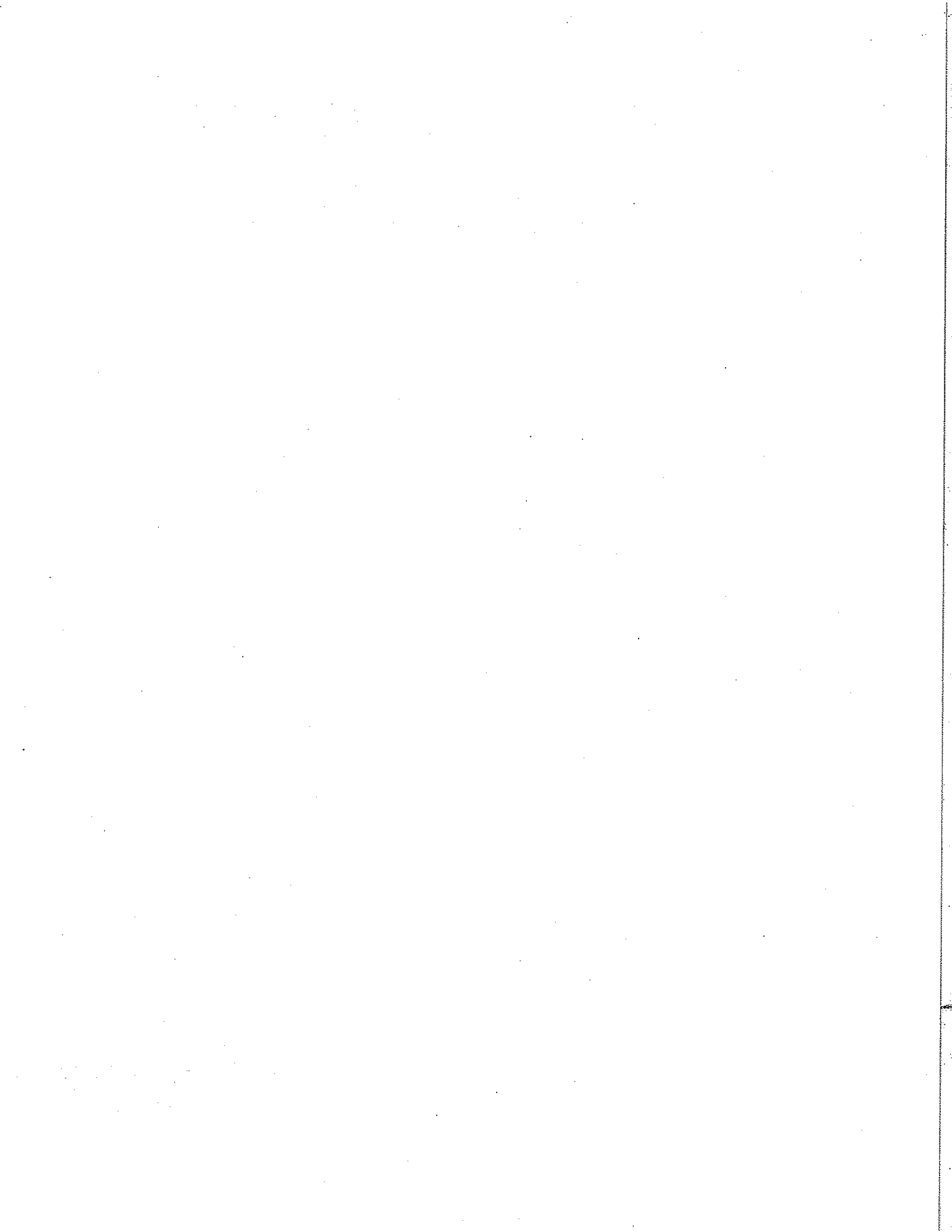
Nicholas:

I wanted to convey a couple comments regarding the proposed guidelines. Overall, they are a good set of guidelines, and body of background - educational material.

A couple points:


- Alterations-Additions: There have been some prior building alterations to historic contributing buildings that led to the building being no longer contributing. These alterations should not be allowed.
- Semantics: 'Original' is used often in the guidelines. It should be clear somehow that this does mean historic original.
- References to the District: There are guideline references to the various district-building qualities. These should likewise be clear in that they refer to those of the historic contributing structures.
- A1.c: Glad to see this included. While there were prior agreements for Waterfront Park, it never-the-less does create an artificial district edge that separates the district from the river that was its original source for being.
- A3: Note the picture of our New Market North Wing facade on page 33 - the 'cast iron' is reproduction non metallic castings; the chimneys also appearing on the top of the New Market Theater are not masonry.
- New Infill: With some much of the district missing buildings, this section is particularly important since the new fabric can potentially override the historic resources.
- D3, D6: Overall height is important as well as ground floor; What about numbers of stories, story to story height ranges?
- Allowed-Discouraged: While it may not fit into the format, it can be useful for designers-developers to know what is discouraged.
- Looking Ahead and Technology: An area always difficult to guide, but what about technology additions? Cell towers, solar panels, green roofs, green walls, wind features?
- Public Improvements: All is focused on the individual sites and so often a great project is reduced by site engineering and public improvements in the right of way that compete and conflict with the sensitivity of the project's good work. Urban and Site Accessories: Likely not a problem, but sometimes there can be inappropriate items.

Appropriate new designs on the redevelopment sites in the District give the opportunity to greatly strengthen the Italianate/cast iron character of the District. <u>The intent of Guideline D1 is to encourage new buildings to respond to and reinforce the principal design elements of the cast-iron buildings that are central to the district's architectural significance and character. not to mimic or copy them in a literal fashion.</u></p> <p>The principal design elements of the Italianate style <u>cast-iron buildings</u> in the District are: ..."</p>	<p>The Old Town/Chinatown Land Use and Design Committee has requested additional revisions to clarify that Guideline D1 is not intended to foster new development that copies the style of Italianate buildings, but rather is intended to encourage buildings to respond to the defining characteristics of the 19th century cast-iron structures that give the district its architectural character.</p>
