ORDINANCE NO. 187545

* Authorize application to the Department of Homeland Security, through its Federal Emergency Management Agency for a grant in the amount of \$331,210 for operations level structural collapse training. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Homeland Security, through its Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has offered the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program since 2000. The purpose of the AFG Program is to enhance through direct financial assistance, the health and safety of the public and firefighting personnel and to provide a continuum of support for emergency responders regarding fire, medical, and all hazard events.
- 2. The objective of the AFG Program is to award funds for critically needed resources to protect the public, to train emergency personnel and to foster interoperability and support community resilience.
- 3. The City of Portland lies within the Cascadia Subduction Zone and straddles three identified crustal faults that stretch the length of Portland: the Oatfield Fault, the East Bank Fault and the Portland Hills Fault.
- 4. It is anticipated that in the event of a Cascadia Subduction Zone or other earthquake, Portland will experience moderate to heavy damage including activation of landslides and extensive building damage. Construction methods especially vulnerable are unreinforced masonry that are at increased risk of partial or complete collapses.
- 5. Portland Fire & Rescue's (PF&R) Operational Guideline, Section 6.2 Structural Collapse, identifies PF&R as the primary responder for structural collapses.
- 6. Using funds from the AFG Program, PF&R proposes to conduct operations level structural collapse training for all truck companies.
- 7. The total cost of training is \$364,331.
- 8. Local match in the amount of \$33,121 will be provided by funds from either FY 2015-2016 or FY 2016-2017 PF&R training program budget appropriations, depending on the grant award date.
- 9. Maintenance of effort requirement: An applicant seeking an AFG grant shall agree to maintain during the term of the grant the applicant's aggregate expenditures relating to the allowable activity at not less than 80 percent of the average amount of such expenditures in the two fiscal years preceding the fiscal year in which the grant amounts are received.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for a grant in the amount of \$331,210.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the grant application must be submitted no later than January 15, 2016. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
