ORDINANCE No. 187 555

Accept a grant in the amount of \$557,227 from Oregon Department of Transportation for N/NE Columbia Blvd Intelligent Transportation Systems and authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Bureau of Transportation applied to Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) for a grant in the amount of \$557,227.00 for N/NE Columbia Blvd Intelligent Transportation Systems on November 1, 2013.
- 2. ODOT has notified the City of Portland that it will award a grant for the N/NE Columbia Blvd Intelligent Transportation Systems to PBOT Bureau in the amount of \$557,227.00.
- 3. The project will identify and evaluate Intelligent Transportation Systems' (ITS) alternatives and will explore emerging technologies/data from private sector to determine whether there are new technologies that can be used to better accommodate freight and transit movements at signalized intersections.
- 4. The project will construct and implement ITS infrastructure along N/NE Columbia Blvd. The project will install electronic message signs, CCTV cameras, traffic monitoring stations, fiber communications, and integrate these devices with the Agency's, ODOT's, and TriMet's Transportation Operation Centers.
- 5. City staff will use the newly installed devices to monitor traffic, relieve congestion, enhance safety, and increase efficiency of existing transportation system.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from ODOT for the N/NE Columbia ITS in the amount of \$557,227.00 and to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.
- b. This is budgeted in FY 15-16 with grant fund 217001 and grant ID TR000174.
- c. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute amendments, approved as to form by the City Attorney, to the scope of the services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the City's financial risk. Increases to the grant amount must be approved by the City Council.

d. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Commissioner-in-Charge's behalf.
