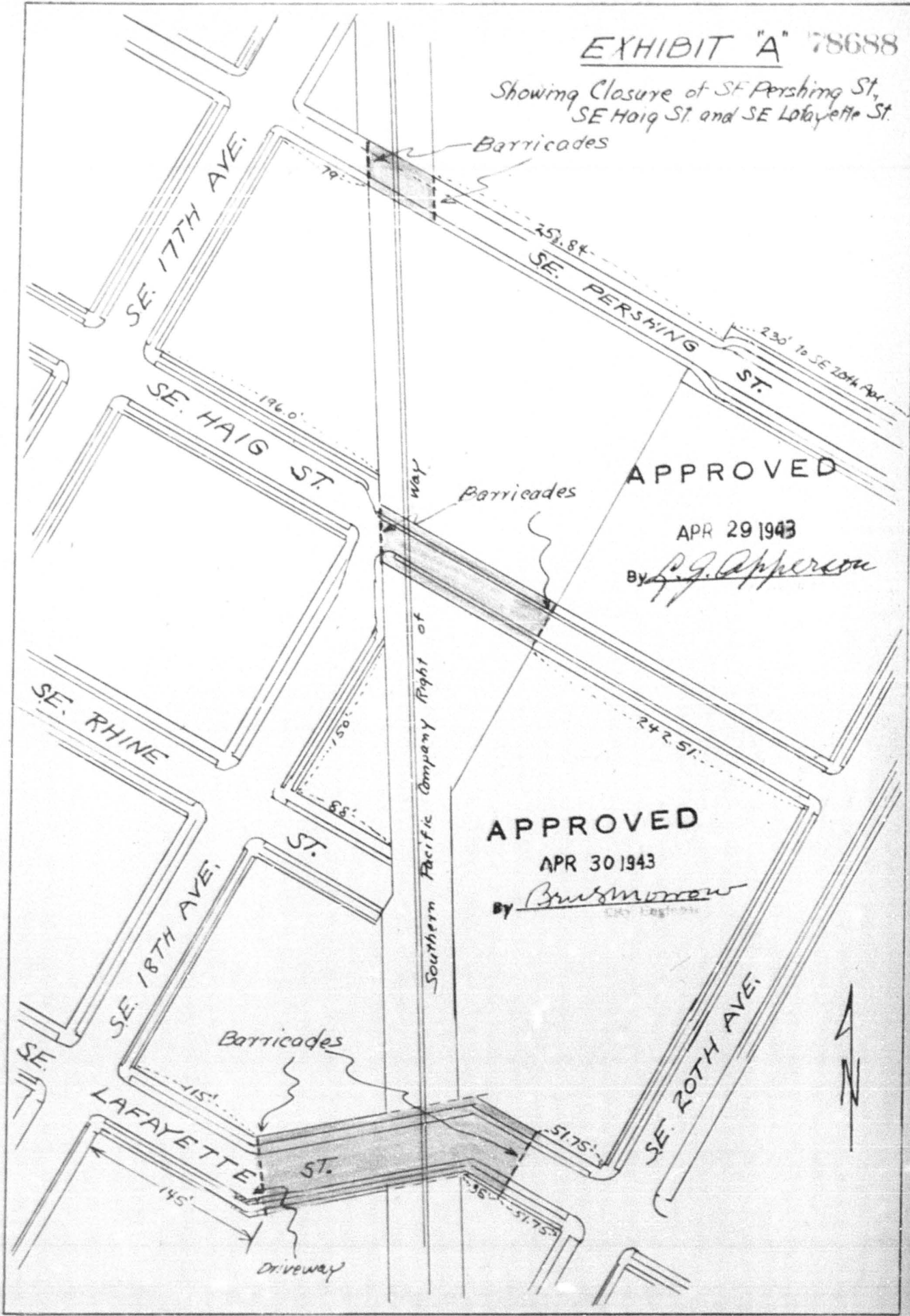
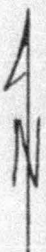

ORDINANCE NO. 78688

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit upon certain conditions for the Southern Pacific Company to temporarily close certain street area at and adjacent to its main line track crossing S.E. Pershing Street, S.E. Haig Street, and S.E. Lafayette Street, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It appearing to the Council that a temporary closing, during the present emergency, of the street area herein specified has been applied for by the Southern Pacific Company; that such closing will be an aid in expediting the transportation of military equipment and supplies; that the City Engineer's office has interviewed industries which are the heaviest users of this street area but encountered no objection to such closing; now, therefore, the Southern Pacific Company is hereby granted a temporary permit to close and barricade such street area against both vehicular and pedestrian traffic, such street area being shown on the sketch hereto attached, marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

This permit is subject to the following conditions and requirements:

1. Said Company shall at its own cost and expense barricade each of said streets with at least two barricades meeting the approval of the City Engineer, so as to stop both pedestrian and vehicular traffic, each of such barricades to be placed at or near the beginning and ending place of said closure and as shown on said sketch, but said portion of S.E. Lafayette Street shall not be closed, barricaded or otherwise excluded until an overhead pedestrian way shall have been constructed at the cost and expense of said Company, such pedestrian way to be provided with steps and constructed in accordance with plans and specifications which shall have been first submitted to and approved by the City Engineer.

2. Each and all of said barricades shall be painted by the Company in white and maintained in that color during the existence of this permit and shall have affixed thereto reflectors which comply with the provisions of article 3, section 22-304 of the war code of this City.

3. This permit is revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Council, and no expenditure of money hereunder, or lapse of time, or other act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland, or be held to give the grantee any vested or other right. Six months after the cessation of the present wars against the United States and a declaration of peace, or within thirty days after the revocation of this permit said Company shall remove each and all of said barricades, including such pedestrian way and steps (if constructed) and shall restore the surface of the street area to a condition as good as that existing before the closing hereby authorized, all of which shall be done to the approval of the City Engineer.

4. The grantee shall hold the City of Portland, the City Engineer, and each and all of the officers and employees of said City free and harmless from any claims for damages to persons or property which may be occasioned by any operation, construction and/or maintenance carried on under the permit hereby granted.

5. This permit shall not be effective until the grantee shall have filed with the City Auditor a document satisfactory to the City Attorney accepting the terms and conditions hereof.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the said grade crossings may be closed to public use without undue delay thus expediting vital military transportation; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
