

ORDINANCE NO. 79803

An Ordinance providing for payment of the sum of \$992.41 in discharge of liens against certain property acquired by the City, authorizing and directing the Mayor and Auditor to draw a warrant therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Section 1. The Council finds that by authority of Ordinance 79803, passed by the Council April 12th, 1944, the City purchased from Multnomah County, Oregon, an undivided one-half interest in and to tax Lot 43, Section 7. T. I.S.R. 2E. W.M., located on the S.E. corner of S.E. Powell Blvd., and S.E. 43rd Avenue, in the City of Portland, Multnomah County, Oregon, and further finds that there exist certain liens against said property in the total amount of \$992.41 (interest included to June 1st, 1944) which the City assumed and agreed to pay; now, therefore, it is hereby provided that the Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant for said amount in payment of said liens (including interest to June 1st, 1944), payable to the City Treasurer and chargeable to the appropriation Public Recreational Areas Fund (5600780).

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: In order that the faith and credit of the City be maintained, it is necessary that all financial obligations be met promptly; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


