WHEREAS, PBOT hopes to continue to Phase II of the application process where the City will refine the technical aspects of its application; and

WHEREAS, the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) has issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity for cities of Portland's size to implement Smart City strategies to address climate change, integrate new technologies, make our streets safer, and provide opportunity to underserved communities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Portland City Council authorizes PBOT to submit an application to the USDOT by February 4, 2016.
