

An Ordinance authorizing the Commissioner of Public Works to enter into an agreement for the rental of Block 54, Stephens' Addition lying Northerly of S.E. Division Street, acquired in widening Union Avenue, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It appearing to the Council that in the proceedings for the widening of Union Avenue, fractional Lots 7 and 8 of Fraction Block 54, North of Division Street, Stephens' Addition, were acquired lying outside of the marginal lines of said avenue and title thereto taken by the City in fee simple, and that said parcel is not needed for street purposes at this time and should be rented if a reasonable offer is made; now, therefore, the Commissioner of Public Works is hereby authorized on behalf of the City to enter into a rental agreement with the party making the best offer for said parcel; the rentals therefor to be paid to the City Treasurer and credited to the General Fund.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: that prompt action may be taken toward renting said parcel; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
