

ORDINANCE NO. 82365

An Ordinance providing for the acquisition of certain sewers and rights of way therefor; and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It appearing to the Council that during the war period certain sewers were constructed by Federal authorities to serve housing projects; that these authorities are now preparing to discontinue such projects and dispose of the property acquired therefor; that portions of the sewers constructed serving such projects will be useful as city sewers to serve the property in the vicinity thereof; now, therefore the Commissioner of Public Works is hereby authorized on behalf of the City to negotiate for and obtain as herein provided such sewers as the City Engineer with the concurrence of said Commissioner determines to be useful for the service of property in the vicinity thereof, it being understood and provided that the cost incurred shall be nominal as to the sewer itself but as to the acquisition of permanent rights of way the cost shall be covered by a local assessment to be made against the property that will be especially benefitted by its accessibility to and use of such sewers, the cost of rights of way to be ascertained by negotiations with the owners and in the event of an agreement acquisitions of right of way by deeds, but in the event of inability to agree proceedings shall be taken therefor as provided in the Charter for obtaining street widening or extension rights of way. Such negotiations shall be conducted by said Commissioner through the City Engineer but no commitments for purchase shall be made without Council approval and provision for payment, it being contemplated that money herefor will be borrowed from the general fund to be reimbursed by a local assessment, but no local assessment shall be made without proceedings as provided by Ordinance for sewage facilities. The foregoing provisions shall expire June 30, 1947.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: The City must be prepared to take prompt action in said matters; therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
