## ORDINANCE No. 187582

\* Apply for a grant from the Oregon Office of Emergency Management in the amount of \$30,000 for the implementation of Collector, a damage assessment application, for the City (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Oregon Office of Emergency Management (OEM) administers the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) grant, which supports local disaster preparedness and response capabilities.
- 2. The grant will be used to increase the number of users and inspections Collector can handle at once, gather and store inspections while offline and conduct a feasibility study to determine what would be needed to operate without internet access during a disaster.
- 3. All programing including the feasibility study would be performed by City of Portland GIS staff. The Bureau of Emergency Management would provide management and oversight.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to apply on behalf of the City of Portland an Oregon Office of Emergency Management State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) program in the amount of \$30,000. There is no match requirement for this grant.
- b. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- c. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by the Oregon Office of Emergency Management for the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP), provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay is likely to impair the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effective from and after its passage by Council.
