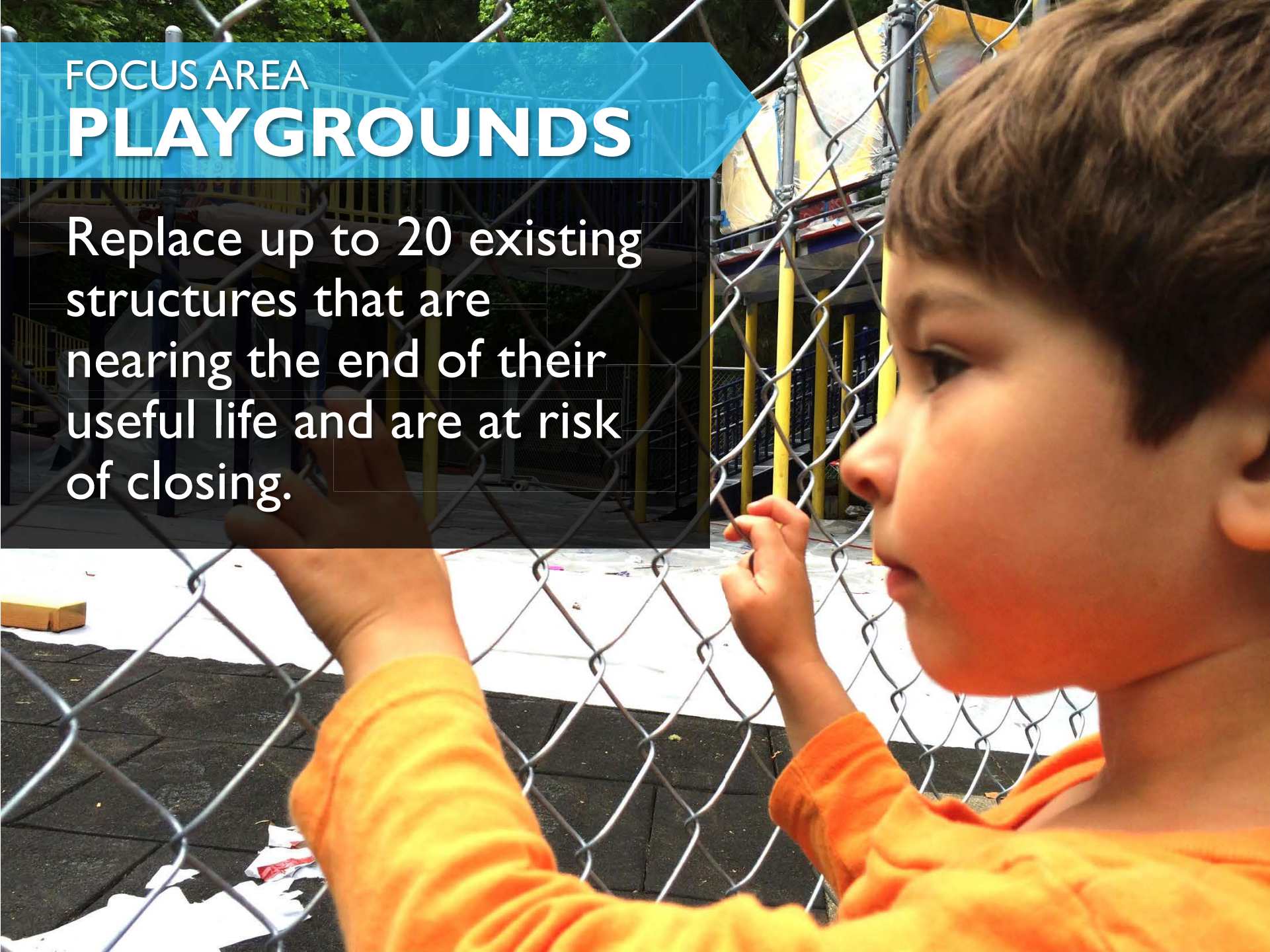

Replace up to 20 existing structures that are nearing the end of their useful life and are at risk of closing.

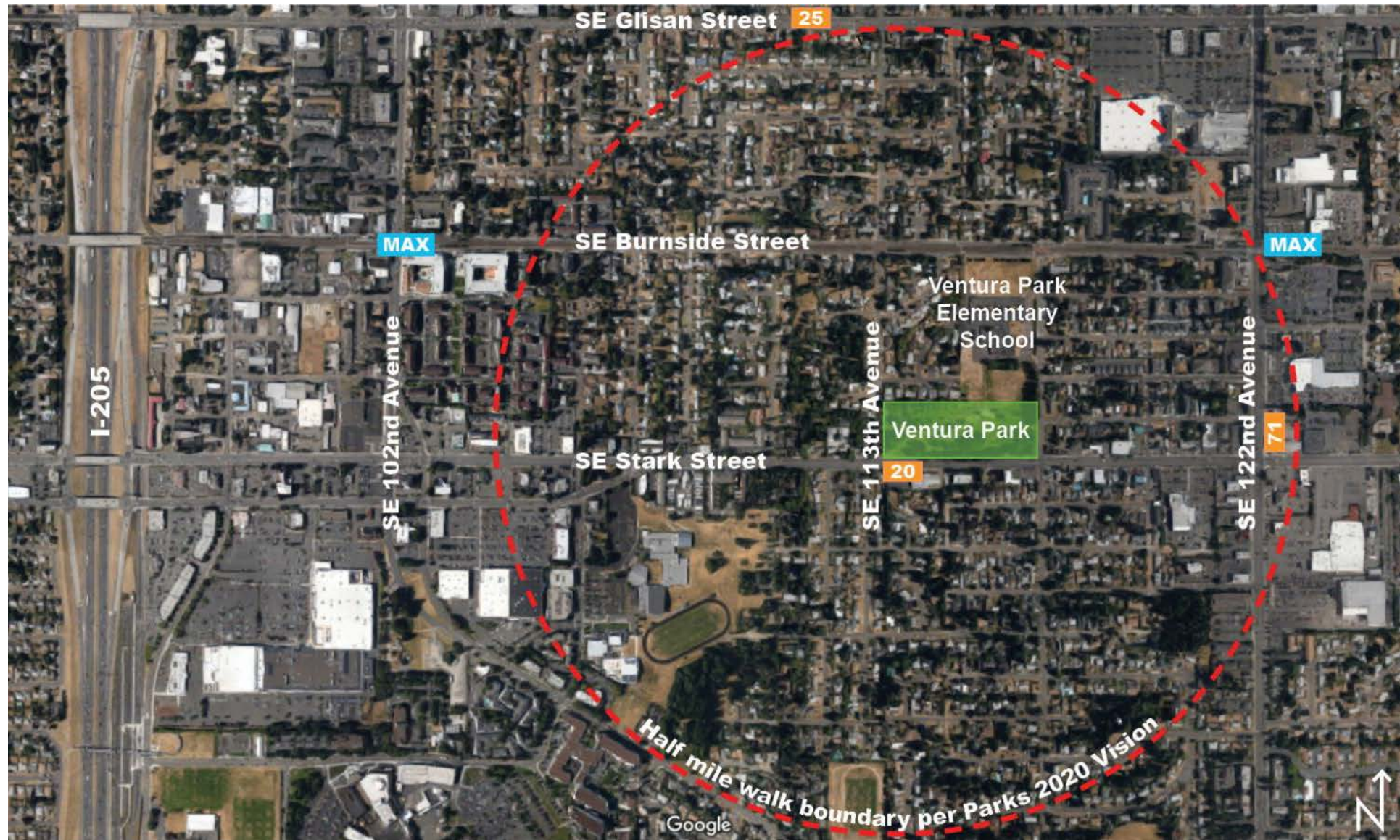
