COLLECTION AGREEMENT
Between The
CITY OF PORTLAND WATER BUREAU
And The
USDA, FOREST SERVICE
PACIFIC NORTHWEST REGION, MT. HOOD NATIONAL FOREST

This COLLECTION AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the CITY OF PORTLAND WATER BUREAU, hereinafter referred to as "The City", and the USDA, Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region, Mt. Hood National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the provisions of the Granger-Thye Act of April 24, 1950.

Background: Funds secured under this collection agreement will be used by the U.S. Forest Service to partially fund a crew of Fisheries Technicians and Biologist to staff and operate rotary smolt traps and provide for necessary supplies in the Upper Sandy River Basin. Funds from the City are those identified under monitoring measures in the 2008 City of Portland's Bull Run Water Supply Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP). The HCP describes actions the City will take to improve habitat conditions in the Bull Run watershed and throughout the Sandy River Basin to contribute to the recovery of native fish populations in the Sandy River Basin. The City has several habitat restoration projects that are required in the HCP as well as several monitoring requirements to document the effectiveness of those actions and to fund larger, basin-wide monitoring efforts that will be used to document fish population trends. These funds will be matched with other financial resources to support the project objectives.

The City has agreed to partially fund the U.S. Forest Service for smolt trap operations within the Sandy River Basin. The U.S. Forest Service and the City are part of a larger group comprised of several county, state and federal agencies and non-governmental organizations, referred to as the Sandy River Basin Monitoring Group (SRBMG). The goal of this group is to monitor aquatic biological and physical habitat conditions within the basin and to use this information in the recovery of three species of Federally Listed fish and other targeted species of interest. Public benefit of this project is that the data collected will be utilized for fish habitat improvements in the Sandy River Basin for native fish population recovery. The U.S. Forest Service has the longest smolt trap data set within the basin, beginning in 1990. In recent years the U.S. Forest Service has operated three to four traps per year, using several funding sources, which included the agreement between The City and the U.S. Forest Service from 2010 to 2015 (10-CO-11060609-012). It is expected, based on current staffing levels and focus areas identified by the SRBMG, the U.S. Forest Service will operate up to six traps within the basin, partially funded by this agreement with the City. Both parties mutually benefit and the data collected by both the City and the U.S. Forest Service contribute towards salmonid recovery in the Sandy River Basin.

Title: NR CWFS/NFXF/NFWF Sandy River Smolt Monitoring with PGE/PWB funds



I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement, and incorporated Financial Plan, is to document the voluntary contribution of funds from The City to the U.S. Forest Service to operate several rotary smolt traps in the Sandy River Basin.

II. THE CITY SHALL:

- A. LEGAL AUTHORITY. The City shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.
- B. Perform in accordance with the Financial Plan.
- C. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, reimburse the U.S. Forest Service the amount agreed to in the Financial Plan.
- D. Provide funds in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 to the U.S. Forest Service to partially fund operation of several smolt traps located in the Sandy River Basin. These funds are available from execution of this instrument to January 1, 2021. These funds will be distributed over 5 fiscal years, beginning in 2016. Available funds to the U.S. Forest Service will vary from year to year based on identified needs by the City and U.S. Forest Service. Funds requested for services through June 30, 2016 are \$38,011.

III. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

- A. REIMBURSABLE BILLING. The U.S. Forest Service shall bill The City quarterly as of March 31, 2016 for funds sufficient to cover the costs for the specific payment period. All reimbursement billings must be completed within the same fiscal year as U.S. Forest Service expenditures. Overhead shall not be assessed due to mutual interest.

The U.S. Forest Service is required to issue bills for expenditures incurred under reimbursable agreements at the end of or prior to the end of each fiscal year. Therefore, an out-of-cycle bill may be received by The City. City funds for each new fiscal year shall be approved by the City's Budget Manager for the City's FY 2016-17 through 2019-20 Budgets.



If payment is not received to the satisfaction of the U.S. Forest Service by the date specified on the Bill for Collection (Form FS-6500-89), the U.S. Forest Service shall exercise its rights regarding the collection of debts owed to the United States.

B. SPECIAL BILLING REQUIREMENTS – FINANCIAL DOCUMENTATION.

Reimbursable billings shall be issued at the prescribed frequency based on expenditures recorded in the U.S. Forest Service accounting system for work performed. Bills for Collection reflect an aggregate amount for the billing period. U.S. Forest Service Transaction Register listing itemized expenses will be provided upon request at the end of a project or annually for long-term agreements. Provision of the Transaction Register or other supporting documentation accompanying individual bills will be limited to agreements over \$2,500, and only when The City requirements are clearly defined within this clause.

C. SPECIAL BILLING REQUIREMENTS – PROGRAM DOCUMENTATION. The U.S. Forest Service Program Manager shall provide The City with a written report that meets The City's specific documentation requirements.

D. Perform in accordance with the attached Financial Plan (Attachment A). The U.S. Forest Service shall provide the City with a new Financial Plan each year for the duration of this agreement no later than January 15th of each calendar year The Financial Plan for 2016 is attached to this Agreement as Attachment A. A copy of the new Financial Plan shall be sent to the City's Program Contact and the City's Administrative contact.

E. Perform in accordance with the Operating Plan (Attachment B). The U.S. Forest Service shall provide the City a new Operating Plan for each year for the duration of this Agreement. The Operating Plan for 2016 is attached to this Agreement as Attachment B. The new Operating plan shall be provided with the new Financial Plan to the City's Program Contact with a copy provided to the City's Administrative Contact.

IV. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- B. FOREST SERVICE LIABILITY TO THE COOPERATOR. The United States shall not be liable to The City for any costs, damages, claims, liabilities, and judgments that arise in connection with the performance of work by the U.S. Forest Service or its contractors under this agreement, including but not limited to damage to any property owned by The City or any third party.
- C. FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA). Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.
- Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally-recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2009 Farm Bill).
- D. PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or The City from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- E. ENDORSEMENT. Any of The City's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of The City's products or activities.
- F. NOTICES. Any communication affecting the operations covered by this agreement by the U.S. Forest Service or The City will be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To The City, at The City's address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.



Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- G. COLLABORATION. The U.S. Forest Service and The City may mutually agree to collaborate in the review of draft publications, interpretive signs, manuscripts, and other printed material and audiovisuals prior to completion. This agreement, in and of itself, does not authorize The City's participation in the project.
- H. USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA. In order for The City to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications (Washington Office). A written request will be submitted by Forest Service **PACIFIC NORTHWEST REGION, MT. HOOD NATIONAL FOREST** to the Office of Communications Assistant Director, Visual Information and Publishing Services prior to use of the insignia. The U.S. Forest Service **PACIFIC NORTHWEST REGION, MT. HOOD NATIONAL FOREST** will notify The City when permission is granted.
- I. U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS, AUDIOVISUALS, AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA. The City shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this agreement.
- J. TERMINATION FOR COLLECTION AGREEMENTS. Either party, in writing, may terminate this agreement in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration. The U.S. Forest Service shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of this agreement after the effective date of termination and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit must be allowed for U.S. Forest Service expenses and all non-cancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination. Excess funds must be refunded within 60 days after the effective termination date.
- K. DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION. The City shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should The City or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- L. MODIFICATIONS. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change. The U.S. Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.



- M. COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature, and has an expiration date of January 1, 2021. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- N. AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement. As part of the 2008 City of Portland Bull Run Water Supply Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP), the City is required to take action to improve habitat conditions in the Bull Run Watershed and throughout the Sandy River Basin so as to contribute to the recovery of native fish populations. The City will contribute funds annually for the Forest Service to assist in the operation and maintenance of rotary screw smolt traps, data collection and data reporting. The Forest Service and the City share a mutual interest in this project to gain data for application towards salmonid recovery and habitat improvement projects in the Sandy River Basin.

In 2016 the Forest Service (Zigzag Ranger District aquatics personnel) shall:

1. Operate 3 rotary screw smolt traps in the Upper Sandy River Basin from April 1 through June 30, 2016.
 - a. **Salmon River**
 - b. **Clear Creek**
 - c. **Still Creek**
2. Perform daily collection and enumeration of juvenile salmon and steelhead in the traps (7 days/week).
3. Perform routine maintenance and repairs of the rotary screw trap equipment.
4. Compile and analyze data and produce a final annual report in collaboration with the City and all other stakeholders of the Sandy River Basin Monitoring Group (SRBMG) following the goals, objectives and methodologies of the smolt trapping program as described in the Sandy River Basin Partners (SRBP) Monitoring Plan.
