## ORDINANCE No. 187608

\* Apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$5,000 and appropriate \$2,500 for FY 2015-16 from the Oregon Impact 2016 Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Mini-Grant program for sworn personnel overtime reimbursement (Ordinance)

### The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Oregon Impact has notified the City that it will award a grant for the FY 2016 Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Mini-Grant program to the Police Bureau in the amount of \$5,000;
- 2. The Bureau wishes to apply for and accept the Oregon Impact grant award;
- 3. Oregon Impact will reimburse the City a maximum of \$5,000 for sworn personnel overtime worked on pedestrian safety enforcement in Portland;
- 4. Oregon Impact reimburses officer overtime at a rate of \$65.83 per hour for activities specified toward this program;
- 5. Local match will be achieved by matching overtime hours with straight-time enforcement hours at a rate of \$45.63 per hour, which will be funded by the Bureau's General Fund appropriation.
- 6. The grant period runs through September 30, 2016; and
- 7. Council declares an emergency exists because a delay would jeopardize the awarding of the grant funds from ODOT TSD.

#### NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to Oregon Impact in a form similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit A for a grant in the amount of \$5,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City a grant from Oregon Impact for the FY 2016 Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Mini-Grant program in the amount of \$5,000.

d. The FY 2015-16 budget is hereby amended as follows:

#### **GRANTS FUND**

Fund - 217 Business Area - PL Bureau Program Expenses - \$2,500

- e. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- f. The Chief of the Police Bureau of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent modifications by Oregon Impact FY 2016 Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Mini-Grant program, provided such modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay would jeopardize the awarding of the grant funds from Oregon Impact. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
