ORDINANCE No. 187625

* Accept and appropriate a grant in the amount of \$98,500 from Metro for the West Willamette Restoration Partnership Project (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

- 1. West Willamette Restoration Partnership includes agencies, conservation organizations and community groups whose mission is to conserve and enhance the forests and natural areas of SW Portland by forming an active coalition of engaged volunteers, community groups, landowners and organizations. The Bureau of Environmental Services and Portland Parks and Recreation are members.
- West Willamette Restoration Partnership applied to Metro for a grant in the amount of \$98,500 for restoration, stewardship and interactive learning to enhance 85 acres of habitat in the Westside Wildlife Corridor connecting Forest Park and Tryon Creek natural areas on *July 7, 2015*; and
- 3. Metro has notified the City of Portland that it will award a grant for the West Willamette Restoration Partnership Project to the Bureau of Environmental Services (as fiscal agent) in the amount of \$98,500;

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from Metro for the West Willamette Restoration Partnership Project in the amount of \$98,500.
- b. The FY 2015/2016 budget is hereby amended as follows:

<u>GRANTS FUND</u> Fund - 217 Business Area - ES Bureau Program Expenses - \$20,493

- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by Metro for West Willamette Restoration Partnership Project grant, Metro Contract No. 933804, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.




