SUBJECT: Transmit 2016 East Portland Action Plan Annual Report

On February 18, 2009, City Council resolved through acceptance of Resolution No. 36682 to adopt the East Portland Action Plan (EPAP) with a charge that the community provide leadership and guidance to public agencies and other entities on how to strategically address the community-identified issues and allocate resources.

The EPAP works with the diverse East Portland community to fulfill the charge and to provide the City with strategic priorities annually, so as to constructively partner in making progress on the 269 items in the Action Plan.

On March 24, 2016, members of the EPAP will briefly report to City Council on its purpose, accomplishments, and successful partnerships with the City. The focus of this year's Annual Report to City Council, attached as Exhibits A-C, is to introduce the EPAP identified Strategic Priorities and Involuntary Displacement Prevention Recommendations. Following the Council hearing, EPAP members will meet individually with the Mayor and with City Commissioners to further discuss accomplishments over the past year and goals for the year to come.

We recommend that Council accept this report.
