together with the right to clear said parcels of land and keep the same clear of all brush, timber, structures, and fire hazards, provided however, the words "fire hazards" shall not be interpreted to include growing crops; and also the present and future right to top, limb, fell, and remove all growing trees, dead trees or snags (collectively called "danger trees") located on Grantor's land adjacent to said parcels of land which could fall upon or against said transmission and signal line facilities.

It is understood and agreed that the right to cut danger trees is limited to a strip of land 100 feet in width on the northwesterly side of and beyond the limits of the right-of-way across said Tract Nos. SJ-B-3 and SJ-B-5, and that such right is limited to a strip of land 100 feet in width, on each side of, and beyond the limits of the right-of-way across said Tract No. SJ-B-7.

THE CITY OF PORTIAND, however, reserves the rights to permit forest cover, including Christmas trees, to grow in the park area crossed by the transmission line right-of-way to a height of fifteen feet, and the right to use any reads developed by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA for trails, bridle paths, or other city park uses, with the understanding that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA will install gates and keep them locked against general use of others. THE CITY OF PORYLAND, however, shall have the right to install its own locks on the gates in order that they may be used jointly by THE CITY OF PORTLAND and the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

All clearing, disposal and line construction operations shall be conducted in compliance with the current Orogon Porcetry Laws, and the instructions of the Park Forester in the field. The contractor shall cooperate to the greatest practicable extent with the Park Forester and the City Fire Bureau in all matters pertaining to the prevention and suppression of fire.

The contractor shall have on the ground at all times, when work is in progress, a representative who shall be authorized to receive and carry out on behalf of the contractor any and all notices and instructions given by the Park Forester or the contracting officer in regard to burning and fire precautions.

Power-driven machinery shall not be used whenever the relative humidity is 30 or below, when it is calm, and 35 or below, when it is windy.

The contractor shall contact the Park Forester before beginning any operation on City Park lands.

Tank trucks or portable water tanks shall be of the 200-gallon capacity specified in the Oregon Forestry Laws.

The contractor shall restore all existing reads used by him to the condition existing at the time of his entry.

Roads, trails and fire breaks shall not be blocked by unattended equipment.

Temporary pioneer roads, if built outside the right-of-way limits for the convenience of clearing and construction operations, shall be approved as to location and construction by the Eureau of Parks.

Also, in addition to the above-described easement and right-of-way, the Grantor herein grants, bargains, sells, and conveys unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA a permanent easement and right-of-way over, upon, and across that portion of the SELWA of Section 4, Township 1 North, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Multnomah County, Oregon, excepting the St. Johns-Bethany 125-foot transmission line right-of-way, as is now surveyed and staked on the ground and as is shown colored in red on drawing, Serial No. SASII, attached hereto and, by reference, made a part of the description of this access road easement and right-of-way, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, and using an access road approximately 14 feet in width, with such additional widths as are necessary to provide for cuts, fills, and turnouts, and for curves at angle points, to be used in connection with the aforementioned transmission line easement and right-of-way, together with such other rights and the right to construct such other appurtenant structures as are necessary to accomplish the purposes for which this access road easement and right-of-way is granted.

The Grantors will be permitted the right of ingress and egress over and across said road, and the right to pass and repass along and on said road insofar as the same extends across the lands of the Grantor, said right to be exercised in a manner that will not interfere with the use of the road by the United States of America, its agents and assigns.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said easements and rights unto the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns, forever.

The Grantor covenants to and with the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns that the title to all brush and timber cut and removed from said parcels of land and also all growing trees, dead trees or snags (collectively called "danger trees") cut and removed from Grantor's land adjacent to said parcels of land is and shall be vested in the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and its assigns and that the consideration paid for convaying said easements and rights herein described is accepted as full compensation for all damages incidental to the exercise of any of said rights.

An Ordinance authorizing the execution of a transmission line and access road easement to the United States of America for the Bonneville Power Administration across certain property of the City of Portland located in Forest Park for the total purchase price of \$4,387.00, upon certain terms and conditions, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that the United States of America, by and through the Bonneville Power Administration, requires a transmission line and access road easement through certain Park Bureau property owned by the City of Portland located in Forest Park, for the construction by the Bonneville Power Administration of a transmission line; that the proposed transmission line easement comprises a right of way 125 feet in width, containing 14.8 acres, and that the access road extends 920 lineal feet; that the value of the said transmission line right of way is \$222.00, the value of the access road right of way is \$50.00, and that the value of the timber located on said right of way is \$4,115.00, making a total value of the right of ways to be granted of \$1,387.00; the Council finds that the Government has offered to the City the aforesaid sum of $$\mu.387.00$ for said easements and that the said total price represents the fair value thereof, and that a transmission line and access road easement should be granted to the United States of America upon terms and conditions as are satisfactory to the Commissioner of Public Affairs; now, therefore, the Mayor and Auditor and Commissioner of Public Affairs hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver on behalf of the City of Portland a transmission line easement across the following parcels of land in the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon:

Tract No. SJ-B-3:

That portion of that part of Lot 3 in Block 11 of Harborton, a subdivision of a part of Section 34, Township 2 North, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Multnomah County, Oregon, lying southwesterly of the existing right-of-way for the U. S. Bonneville Power Administration's St. Johns-Astoria transmission line, which lies southerly of a line 62.5 feet distant northerly from and parallel to the survey line of the St. Johns-Bethany transmission line as now located and staked on the ground over, across, upon, and/or adjacent to the above-described property, said survey line being particularly described as follows:

Beginning at survey station 194 / 35.8, a point in the Jacob Sanders Donation Land Claim No. 53, Township 2 North, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, said point being N. 40° 56' 50" E. a distance of 2040.2 feet from the southwest corner of Section 34 Township 2 North, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian; thence S. 56° 12' 25" W. a distance of 1014.2 feet to survey station 204 / 50.0; thence S. 59° 02' 15" W. a distance of 558.8 feet to survey station 210 / 08.8, a point on the west line of said section 34, said point being N. 1° 39' 08" E. a distance of 695.6 feet from the southwest corner of said Section 34.

Beginning at survey station 223 / 14.4, a point on the north line of Section 4, Township 1 North, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, said point being N. 88° 21' 40" W. a distance of 1081.1 feet from the northeast corner of said Section 4; thence S. 43° 05' 20" W. a distance of 2517.9 feet to survey station 248 / 32.3 Bk = 248 / 50.0 Ah; thence S. 49° 37' 40" W. a distance of 3169.1 feet to survey station 280 / 19.1; thence S. 46° 47' 30" W. a distance of 277.2 feet to survey station 282 / 96.3, a point on the West line of Section 4, said point being N. 2° 32'50" E. a distance of 986.6 feet from the southwest corner of said Section 4.

Section 2. Said easement shall also grant unto the United States of America a permanent easement and right of way 14 feet in width, the center line of which is shown on Drawing No. 122-12-D, dated December 20, 1954, United States Department of the Interior, Bonneville Power Administration, Ross-Bethany No. 1, and is more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point 62.5 feet east of Survey Station 248 / 50 on the United States Bonneville Power Administration St. Johns-Bethany Section of the Ross-Bethany transmission line no. 1, proceeding south 26° west for 70 feet, thence south 13° west for 123 feet; thence south 15° east for 71 feet; thence south 22° 30° east for 47 feet; thence south 30° west for 51 feet; thence south 87° west for 67 feet; thence south 59° west for 56 feet; thence south 32° west for 52 feet; thence south 88° west for 61 feet; thence south 86° west for 61 feet; thence south 31° west for 71 feet; thence south 14° west for 138 feet to the south line of the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 4, Township 1 North, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Multnomah County, Oregon.

Section 3. Said easement deed shall be in form acceptable to the City Attorney and shall make such provision for fire protection on said right of ways as is required by the Commissioner of Public Affairs; the City of Portland shall, however, reserve the right to permit forest covering, including Christmas trees, to grow in the park area crossed by the transmission line right of way to a height of 15 fect and shall have the right to use any roads developed by the United States of America for trails, bridle paths, or other park uses, with the understanding that the United States of America shall install gates and keep them locked against general use of others; the City of Portland, however, shall have the right to install its own locks on the gates in order that they may be used jointly by the City of Portland and the United States of America.

Section 4. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to cash the check in the amount of \$4,307.00 to be paid as compensation to the City for said easements and to credit the same to the Public Recreation Areas Fund (106); the Mayor and Commissioner of Public Affairs are hereby authorized and directed to execute all necessary voucher certificates and other papers required by the United States Government in connection with the issuance of said check.

Section 5. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portland in this: in order that there may be no delay in making available to the Bonneville Power Administration the necessary easements and right of ways for the purpose of furnishing adequate power facilities to the public; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
