 the Pert Fosester in the ILald. The sestractor shall socperato to the erokest practicable extent with the Park Forester and the City Fire Bureau in all matters pertaining to the prevention and suppression of fire.

The contractor shall have on the ground at all times, when work is in progress, a representative tho shall be authorized to receive and carry out on behalf of the contractor any and all notices and instructions given by the Park Forester or the contracting officer in regard to burning and fire precautions.

Power-driven machinary shell not be used whenever the relative humidity is 30 or below, when it is celm, and 35 or below, when it is windy.

The contractor shali contact the Park Forester before beginning anv operation on City Park lands.

Tank trucks or portable water tank shall te of the 200-gailon capacity specified in the Oregon Forestry Laws.

The contractor shall restore all existing roads used by him to the condition existing at the time of his entry.

Roads, trails and fire breaks shall not be blocked by unattended equipment. Tenporary pioneer roads; if built outside the right-of-way limita for the convenience of clearing and construction operations, shall be approved as to location and construction by the Bureau of Parks.

Also, in addition to the above-described easemant and right-of-way, the Grantor herein grants, bargains, sells, and conveyz unto the UIITED STATES OF ANERICA a permanent easoment and right-of-way over, upon, and across that portion of the selywis of Section 4, Township I North, Range 1 West, Willanotte Noridian, multnomah County, Oregon, excepting tha St. Johne-Bethany 125-foot tranamission line right-oi-way, as is now surveyed and staked on the ground and as is shown colored in red on draung, Serial Mo. 8481, attached hereto and, by reference, made a part of the description of this access road casement and right-of-way, for the purpose of conotructing, maintaining, and using an accese road approximately 14 feet in width, with such additional widths as are necessary to provide for cuts, fills, and turnouts, and for curves at angle points, to be used in connection with the aformenticned transwission line acaement and right-ol-way, together with such other rights and the right to construct such other appursenant structures as are necessery to accomplish the purposes for which this access roed easement and right-af-may is granted.

## ORDINANCE No. Wrather

An Ordinance authorizing the execution of a transmi sion line and access rond easement to the United States of America for the Bonneville Power Administration across certain property of the City of Portland located in Forest Park for the total purchase price of $\$ 4,387.00$, upon certain terms and conditions, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:
Section 1. The Corncil finds that the United States of America, by and throuci the Bonneville Power Administration, requires a transmission line and access road easement through certain Park Bureau property omed by the City of Portland located in Forest Park, for the construction by the Bonneville Pover Administration of a transmission line; that the proposed transmission line easement ccmprises a richt of way 125 feet in width, containing 14.8 acres, and that the access rocd extends 920 lineal feet; that the value of the said transmission line richt of way is $\$ 222.00$, the value of the access road richt of vay is $\$ 50.00$, and that the value of the timber located on said right of way is $\$ 4,115.00$, makinc a total value of the richt of ways to be cranted of $\$ 4.387 .00$; the Council finds that the Government has offered to the City the aforesaid sum of $\$ 4,307.00$ for said easements and that the said total price represerts the fair value thereof, and that a transmission line and access road easement should be granted to the United States of America upon terms and conditions as are satisfactory to the Commissioner of Public Affairs; now, therefore, the Mayor and Auditor and Commissioner of Public Affairs hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver on behalf of the City of portland a transmission line easement across the following parcels of land in the County of lultnomah, State of Oregon:

Section 4. The Citr Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to cash the check in the amount of $\$ 4,307.00$ to be aad as compensation to the City for said easements and to credit the same to the Public Jecreation Areas Fund (106); the Mayor and Commissioner of Fublic Affairs are hereby authorized and directed to execute all necessary voucher certificates and other papers required by the United States Government in connection rith the issuance of said check.

Section 5. Inasmush as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservacion of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Portiand in this: in order that there may be no delay in makine available to the Bonneville Power Administration the necessary easements and richt of ways for the purpose of furnishing adequate power facilities to the public; therefore, an emerconcy hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance siall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
