CONCERN 1

When sidewalks are closed off the barricades are not standardized.

SOLUTION

The barricades should be standardized for the following reasons.

- 1. People who are visually impaired could easily recognize the fact that the sidewalk is closed.
- I use a guide dog and it would be easy to train them to take you right to the barrier and you could determine that the sidewalk is closed.
- 3. The existing barricades are as varied as the workplace. Sometimes workers use only safety ribbon; and that can be hazardous when you are trying to navigate the construction area.

CONCERN 2

The barricades need to have a light and audible component that is connected to a sensor so that a visually impaired person could have warning of upcoming closures.

SOLUTION

Below is a company that provides warning systems that could be fitted to a standard barricade.

CONCERN 3

Noise is a significant barrier when it is near an intersection.

SOLUTION

Companies that are doing permitted work in the city could be asked to assign a worker to watch for pedestrians that may have difficulties navigating the closure. The city could also be asked to do the same thing.
