

ORDINANCE No. 187695

*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University to conduct research and co-create criteria and key data for measuring success of future youth programs for an amount not to exceed \$30,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. In 2015, Mayor Hales announced a \$2 million ongoing investment in Portland Parks & Recreation's (PP&R's) Teen Services Program to implement a Community Center Initiative to engage at-risk youth.
2. Under the Mayor's Community Center Initiative, PP&R has provided youth with free access to community centers during out of school times, expanded youth programming, and leveraged the resources of community partners to design and execute pro-social activities for high risk youth.
3. PP&R has requested the services of Portland State University's Center for Public Service to assess the first year of the Mayor's Community Center Initiative and co-create criteria and key data for measuring success of the Initiative and other PP&R youth programs.
4. To accomplish this, Portland State University will: lead a series of facilitated discussions with key stakeholders, research positive youth development models and best practices, share findings from facilitated discussions and research with a core team of PP&R staff, and work with the core team to establish criteria and key data for measuring success of future youth programs. PSU will also produce a report of findings from this project and a separate report capturing the first year of the Mayor's Community Center Initiative.
5. This Intergovernmental Agreement has a term of (9) months and compensation under the agreement will not exceed \$30,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Oregon, on behalf of Portland State University, whereby PSU will perform research and assist with the establishment of criteria and key data for measuring success of the Mayor's Community Center Initiative and other PP&R youth programs for PP&R. Such Intergovernmental Agreement shall be in a form

substantially like the form of agreement attached hereto, as approved as to form by the City Attorney.

- b. PP&R's Strategies and Initiatives Manager, or his designee, is authorized to execute project specific agreements or task orders pursuant to this Agreement.
- c. The Director of Portland Parks & Recreation and the Auditor are authorized to provide payment chargeable to the applicable budgets when demand is presented and approved by the appropriate authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in funding would interrupt Portland State University's ability to complete services in an ideal timeframe; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
