





EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

- During the 2013–2014 school year, Vietnamese and Chinese were among the top five languages spoken by English language learners (ELLs) in Oregon's public schools. Other top Asian or Pacific Island languages spoken by ELL students are Chuukese, Korean, Marshallese, Japanese, Hmong, and Tagalog.²
- The statewide graduation rate for NHPI public high school students in the 2010–2014 cohort was 71%, a rate lower than average (76%). The dropout rate for NHPI was 6%, identical to Black or African American students.³

HOUSING

- 39% NHPI own homes
- 53% of NHPI renter households are costburdened
- Average NHPI household is larger than all racial groups except for Latinos

- 25% of Korean homeowners are severely cost-burdened spending
- Over 50% of Vietnamese Oregonians are severely housing-cost burdened
