Consideration

- (a) City agrees to pay Consultant a sum not to exceed 150,000 for accomplishment of the work.
- (b) Interim payments shall be made to Consultant according to the schedule identified in the STATEMENT OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Standard of Care

Consultant shall perform all services under this contract using that care, skill, and diligence that would ordinarily be used by similar professionals in this community in similar circumstances.

2. Effect of Expiration

Passage of the contract expiration date shall not extinguish, prejudice, or limit either party's right to enforce this Contract with respect to any default or defect in performance that has not been corrected.

3. Order of Precedence

This contract consists of these Terms and Conditions, the Statement of Work and Payment Schedule, and any exhibits that are attached. Any apparent or alleged conflict between these items will be resolved by using the following order of precedence:

a) these Terms and Conditions; b) Statement of Work and Payment Schedule; and c) any exhibits attached to the contract.

4. Early Termination of Contract

- (a) The City may terminate this Contract for convenience at any time for any reason deemed appropriate in its sole discretion. Termination is effective immediately upon notice of termination given by the City.
- (b) Either party may terminate this Contract in the event of a material breach by the other party that is not cured. Before termination is permitted, the party seeking termination shall give the other party written notice of the breach, its intent to terminate, and fifteen (15) calendar days to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within 15 days, the party seeking termination may terminate immediately by giving written notice that the Contract is terminated.

5. Remedies and Payment on Early Termination

- (a) If the City terminates pursuant to 4(a) above, the City shall pay the Consultant for work performed in accordance with the Contract prior to the termination date. No other costs or loss of anticipated profits shall be paid.
- (b) If the City terminates pursuant to 4(b) above, the City is entitled all remedies available at law or equity. In addition, Consultant shall pay the City all damages, costs, and sums incurred by the City as a result of the breach.
- (c) If the Consultant justifiably terminates the contract pursuant to subsection 4(b), the Consultant's only remedy is payment for work prior to the termination. No other costs or loss of anticipated profits shall be paid.
- (d) If the City's termination under Section 4(b) was wrongful, the termination shall be automatically converted to one for convenience and the Consultant shall be paid as if the Contract was terminated under Section 4(a).
- (e) In the event of early termination the Consultant's work product before the date of termination becomes property of the City.

6. Assignment

Consultant shall not subcontract, assign, or transfer any of the work scheduled under this agreement, without the prior written consent of the City. Notwithstanding City approval of a subconsultant, the Consultant shall remain obligated for full performance hereunder, and the City shall incur no obligation other than its obligations to the Consultant hereunder. The Consultant agrees that if subconsultants are employed in the performance of this Agreement, the Consultant and its subconsultants are subject to the requirements and sanctions of ORS Chapter 656, Workers' Compensation.

7. Compliance with Applicable Law

Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations. Consultant agrees it currently is in compliance with all tax laws. Consultant shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and its corresponding regulations. In connection with its activities under this Contract, the Consultant shall comply with all applicable Grant Terms and conditions. This includes all terms and conditions contained in this contract and, for a contract involving a grant, the Grant Terms and Conditions.

8. Indemnification for Property Damage and Personal Injury

Consultant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents, and employees, from all claims, losses, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney fees) for personal injury and property damage arising out of the intentional or negligent acts or omissions of the Consultant, its Subconsultants, suppliers, employees or agents in the performance of its services. Nothing in this paragraph requires the Consultant or its insurer to indemnify the City for claims of personal injury or property damage caused by the negligence of the City. This duty shall survive the expiration or termination of this contract.

9. Insurance

Consultant shall obtain and maintain in full force at Consultant expense, throughout the duration of the Contract and any warranty or extension periods, the required insurance identified below. The City reserves the right to require additional insurance coverage as required by statutory or legal changes to the maximum liability that may be imposed on Oregon cities during the term of the Contract.

(a)	Workers' compensation insurance as required by ORS Chapter 656 and as it may be amended. Unless exempt under ORS Chapter 656, the Consultant and all subconsultants shall maintain coverage for all subject workers.

There shall be no termination, cancellation, material change, potential exhaustion of aggregate limits or non renewal of coverage without thirty (30) days written notice from Consultant to the City. If the insurance is canceled or

terminated prior to completion of the Contract, Consultant shall immediately notify the City and provide a new policy with the same terms. Any failure to comply with this clause shall constitute a material breach of Contract and shall be grounds for immediate termination of this Contract.

Additional Insured: The liability insurance coverages, except Professional Liability, Errors and Omissions, or Workers' Compensation, shall be without prejudice to coverage otherwise existing, and shall name the City of Portland and its bureaus/divisions, officers, agents and employees as Additional Insureds, with respect to the Consultant's activities to be performed, or products or services to be provided. Coverage shall be primary and non-contributory with any other insurance and self-insurance. Notwithstanding the naming of additional insureds, the insurance shall protect each additional insured in the same manner as though a separate policy had been issued to each, but nothing herein shall operate to increase the insurer's liability as set forth elsewhere in the policy beyond the amount or amounts for which the insurer would have been liable if only one person or interest had been named as insured.

Certificate(s) of Insurance: Consultant shall provide proof of insurance through acceptable certificate(s) of insurance, including additional insured endorsement form(s) and all other relevant endorsements, to the City prior to the award of the Contract if required by the procurement documents (e.g., request for proposal), or at execution of Contract and prior to any commencement of work or delivery of goods or services under the Contract. The Certificate(s) will specify all of the parties who are endorsed on the policy as Additional Insureds (or Loss Payees). Insurance coverages required under this Contract shall be obtained from insurance companies acceptable to the City of Portland. The Consultant shall pay for all deductibles and premium. The City reserves the right to require, at any time, complete, certified copies of required insurance policies, including endorsements evidencing the coverage the required.

Subconsultant(s): Consultant shall provide evidence that any subconsultant, if any, performing work or providing goods or service under the Contract has the same types and amounts of coverages as required herein or that the subconsultant is included under Consultant's policy.

10. Ownership of Work Product

All work product produced by the Consultant under this contract is the exclusive property of the City. "Work Product" includes, but is not limited to: research, reports, computer programs, manuals, drawings, recordings, photographs, artwork and any data or information in any form. The Consultant and the City intend that such Work Product shall be deemed "work made for hire" of which the City shall be deemed the author. If for any reason a Work Product is deemed not to be a "work made for hire," the Consultant hereby irrevocably assigns and transfers to the City all right, title and interest in such work product, whether arising from copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret, or any other state or federal intellectual property law or doctrines. Consultant shall obtain such interests and execute all documents necessary to fully vest such rights in the City. Consultant waives all rights relating to work product, including any rights arising under 17 USC 106A, or any other rights of authorship, identification or approval, restriction or limitation on use or subsequent modifications. If the Consultant is an architect, the Work Product is the property of the Consultant-Architect, and by execution of this contract, the Consultant-Architect grants the City an exclusive and irrevocable license to use that Work Product.

Notwithstanding the above, all pre-existing trademarks, services marks, patents, copyrights, trade secrets, and other proprietary rights of Consultant are and will remain the exclusive property of Consultant.

11. EEO Certification

In the event Consultant provides in excess of \$2,500.00 for services to the City in any fiscal year, Consultant shall obtain EEO certification from the City.

12. Equal Benefits

Consultant must comply with the City's Equal Benefits program as prescribed by Chapter 3.100 of the Code of the City of Portland. The required documentation must be filed with Procurement Services, City of Portland, prior to contract execution.

13. Successors in Interest

The provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and approved assigns.

14. Severability

The parties agree that if any term or provision of this contract is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the contract did not contain the particular term or provision held to be invalid.

15. Waiver

The failure of the City to enforce any provision of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the City of that or any other provision.

16. Errors

The Consultant shall promptly perform such additional services as may be necessary to correct errors in the services required by this contract without undue delays and without additional cost.

17. Governing Law/Venue

The provisions of this contract shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of Oregon without reference to its conflict of laws provisions that might otherwise require the application of the law of any other jurisdiction. Any action or suits involving any question arising under this contract must be brought in the appropriate court in Multnomah County Oregon.

18. Amendments

All changes to this contract, including changes to the scope of work and contract amount, must be made by written amendment and approved by the Chief Procurement Officer to be valid. Any amendment that increases the original contract amount by more than 25% must be approved by the City Council to be valid.

19. Business Tax Registration

The Consultant shall obtain a City of Portland business tax registration number as required by PCC 7.02 prior to beginning work under this Contract.

20. Prohibited Conduct

The Consultant shall not hire any City employee who evaluated the proposals or authorized the award of this Contract for two years after the date the contract was authorized without the express written permission of the City and provided the hiring is permitted by state law.

21. Payment to Vendors and Subconsultants

The Consultant shall timely pay all subconsultants and suppliers providing services or goods for this Contract.

22. Access to Records

The Consultant shall maintain all records relating to this Contract for three (3) years after final payment. The City may examine, audit and copy the Consultant's books, documents, papers, and records relating to this contract at any time during this period upon reasonable notice. Copies of these records shall be made available upon request. Payment for the reasonable cost of requested copies shall be made by the City.

23. Audits

- (a) The City may conduct financial and performance audits of the billings and services specified in this agreement at any time in the course of the agreement and during the three (3) year period established by paragraph 22. Audits will be conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards as promulgated in <u>Government Auditing Standards</u> by the Comptroller General of the United States Government Accountability Office.
- (b) If an audit discloses that payments to the Consultant exceed the amount to which the Consultant was entitled, the Consultant shall repay the amount of the excess to the City.

24. Electronic Signatures

The City and Consultant may conduct this transaction, including any contract amendments, by electronic means, including the use of electronic signatures.

25. Merger Clause

This Contract encompasses the entire agreement of the parties, and supersedes all previous understandings and agreements between the parties, whether verbal or written.

26. Dispute Resolution/Work Regardless of Disputes

The parties shall participate in mediation to resolve disputes before conducting litigation. The mediation shall occur at a reasonable time after the conclusion of the Contract with a mediator jointly selected by the parties. Notwithstanding any dispute under this Contract, the Consultant shall continue to perform its work pending resolution of a dispute, and the City shall make payments as required by the Contract for undisputed portions of the work. In the event of litigation no attorney fees are recoverable. No different dispute resolution paragraph(s) in this contract or any attachment hereto shall supersede or take precedence over this provision.

27. Progress Reports: /■/ Applicable /□/ Not Applicable

If applicable, the Consultant shall provide monthly progress reports to the Project Manager as described in the Statement of the Work and Payment Schedule.

28. Consultant's Personnel: / Applicable / Not Applicable

If applicable, the Consultant shall assign the personnel listed in the Statement of the Work and Payment Schedule for the work required by the Contract and shall not change personnel without the prior written consent of the City, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

29. Subconsultants

The Consultant shall use the subconsultants identified in its proposals. The Consultant shall not change subconsultant assignments without the prior written consent of the Chief Procurement Officer. The City will enforce all social equity contracting and Minority,

Women and Emerging Small Business (M/W/ESB) subcontracting commitments submitted by the Consultant in its proposals. Failure to use the identified M/W/ESB subconsultants without prior written consent is a material breach of contract. For contracts valued \$50,000 or more, the Consultant shall submit a Monthly Subconsultant Payment and Utilization Report (MUR), made part of this contract by reference, reporting ALL subconsultants employed in the performance of this agreement. An electronic copy of the MUR may be obtained by contacting the PTE Contract Compliance Specialist.

30. Third Party Beneficiaries

There are no third party beneficiaries to this contract. Enforcement of this contract is reserved to the parties.

31. Conflict of Interest

Consultant hereby certifies that, if applicable, its contract proposal is made in good faith without fraud, collusion or connection of any kind with any other proposer of the same request for proposals or other City procurement solicitation(s), that the Consultant as a proposer has competed solely on its own behalf without connection or obligation to, any undisclosed person or firm. Consultant certifies that it is not a City official/employee or a business with which a City official/employee is associated, and that to the best of its knowledge, Consultant, its employee(s), its officer(s) or its director(s) is not a City official/employee or a relative of any City official/employee who: i) has responsibility in making decisions or ability to influence decision-making on the contract or project to which this contract pertains; ii) has or will participate in evaluation or management of the contract; or iii) has or will have financial benefits in the contract. Consultant understands that should it elect to employ any former City official/employee during the term of the contract then that the former City official/Consultant employee must comply with applicable government ethics and conflicts of interest provisions in ORS Chapter 244, including but not limited to ORS 244.040(5) and ORS 244.047, and the City's Charter, Codes and administrative rules, including lobbying prohibitions under Portland City Code Section 2.12.080.

32. Respectful Workplace Behavior

The City of Portland is committed to a respectful work environment, free of harassment, discrimination and retaliation and other inappropriate conduct. Every individual has a right to work in a professional atmosphere where all individuals are treated with respect and dignity. The City's HR Rule 2.02 covers all employees with the City of Portland as well as consultants, vendors or consultants who provide services to the City of Portland. By signing this Contract/Agreement, the Consultant indicates compliance with all terms and conditions contained in this Contract including HR 2.02.

STATEMENT OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

SCOPE OF WORK

The consultant shall undertake an independent and comprehensive assessment of the City of Portland's design overlay zone as outlined below:

- 1. <u>Project Tasks</u>. The Proposer will be responsible for tasks associated with Phases 1-4 of the Project Outline below.
 - a. Phase 1 Research. The Consultant will be responsible for researching best practices for discretionary and non-discretionary approaches to design review using examples from other cities locally, nationally or internationally. The purpose of the research is to determine how other jurisdictions have successfully administered design-related tools and processes to achieve multiple planning goals and desired outcomes. Typical subjects that will be addressed in the research include: design-related zoning regulations and discretionary guidelines; discretionary design review processes and administration of design review; the structure of decision-making bodies, such as commissions or boards, and hearings; and community input into design of new development.

The Consultant will provide a white paper of best practices, along with a discussion of case law that affects design review.

The Consultant will present this report to the Portland Design Commission in a written form and a summary PowerPoint. They will also provide photographic examples of some of the developments generated through those different approaches. We will group them into typologies that are being seen in urban neighborhoods as a result of changing market demands.

b. <u>Phase 2 – Assessment</u>. The Consultant will develop a work plan to gather and synthesize information, observations, and feedback from (1) analyzing sample sites; (2) conducting

interviews and roundtables with applicants and stakeholders; and (3) surveying applicants, stakeholders, and the public to identify issues that are working well or not working well. In this phase, the Proposer will conduct the assessment and then develop and prioritize a set of issues that need to be addressed.

- (1) Sample Sites. The consultant will work with City staff to select examples in various districts, including the Central City and other rapidly changing areas not covered by the Design Review overlay as to how the current system operates and what it produces. A smaller subset may be selected for more, in-depth examination. The consultant will work with staff to ensure the analysis provides for valid comparisons. The economists on the team will review real estate data to help the team identify meaningful comparables between areas with design overlay and those without. The consultant will also look at what economic and market factors might have produced particular results. To the extent possible, the analysis will include sites with similar base zone requirements (e.g., mix of uses, density, height, setbacks, transit streets) in the various locations (D overlay and non-D overlay).
- (2) Interviews. The Proposer will conduct 25-30 sessions of individual stakeholder interviews and roundtable discussions with interested and effected parties to help identify challenges and issues with the current system, in terms of both regulatory tools and process. With assistance from City staff, the Consultant will identify key groups and individuals to interview. Some interviews will take the form of discussion groups with particular questions or issues discussed. Some interviews and groups will be 2-3 people to allow for in depth conversation, while ensuring privacy and anonymity. The Consultant will also interview a representative number of design firms to understand their experiences with the current process. Participants will be asked to identify what issues need to be addressed in the future.
- (3) Surveys. The Proposer will conduct surveys to reach a broad audience. We will work with the City to devise a simple, easy to take, on-line survey, aimed at a broader public. Surveys will help identify the issues and challenges with the current system, in terms of both regulatory tools and process.

The Consultant will present the results of this phase to the Portland Design Commission, using a PowerPoint summary. The methodology and key points derived from discussions will be discussed.

The Consultant will produce a white paper and a PowerPoint summarizing the findings. More detailed information will be found in an appendix.

c: <u>Phase 3 – Preliminary Recommendations and Workshop</u>. The Consultant will develop preliminary recommendations grouped by category – in coordination with City staff - to respond to issues identified in Phase 2.

The Consultant will structure a workshop to allow for the public to understand and weigh in on recommendations. The Consultant will work with City staff to create tools that allow the broader community to weigh in on the recommendations.

Following input from the workshop and community outreach tools, we will refine the preliminary alternative recommendations and discuss them with the City staff.

- d. Phase 4 Final Recommendations. After reflecting upon the comments received in the prior phase, the Consultant will finalize the selection of preferred alternatives. The Consultant will highlight those recommendations that could be more immediately implemented and those that require more time to work out details and seek more comment. The Consultant will present final recommendations to Portland's Planning and Sustainability Commission, the Portland Design Commission, and the Portland City Council.
- 2. <u>Ongoing Coordination</u>. The Consultant's Project Manager will confer with the City's Project Manager every two weeks. At least four times during the course of the effort, the meetings will be face to face and address a number of issues in detail. Other times will involve a conference call to discuss progress and issues. The Consultant team will provide an expanded outline of major reports in advance so that the City can see the general content. From time to time, it might be necessary to

have other members of the City team or the consultant team be a part of the discussions—particularly the monthly meetings.

If work is completed before the "not to exceed" amount is reached, the Consultant's compensation will be based on the Consultant's bills previously submitted for acceptable work performed and approved.

Progress Payments

On or before the 15th of each month, the Consultant shall submit to the City's Project Manager an invoice for work performed by the Consultant during the preceding month. The invoice shall contain the City's Contract Number and set out all items for payment including, but not limited to: the name of the individual, labor category, direct labor rate, hours worked during the period, and tasks performed. The Consultant shall also attach photocopies of claimed reimbursable expenses, if applicable. The Consultant shall stamp and approve all subconsultant invoices and note on the subconsultant invoice what they are approving as "billable" under the contract. The billing from the prime should clearly roll up labor and reimbursable costs for the prime and subconsultants — matching the subconsultant invoices. Prior to initial billing, the Consultant shall develop a billing format for approval by the City.

The City shall pay all amounts to which no dispute exists within 30 days of receipt of the invoice. Payment of any bill, however, does not preclude the City from later determining that an error in payment was made and from withholding the disputed sum from the next progress payment until the dispute is resolved.

The Consultant shall make full payment to its subconsultants within 10 business days following receipt of any payment made by the City to Consultant.

ACH Payments

It is the City's policy to pay its Consultant invoices via electronic funds transfers through the automated clearing house (ACH) network. To initiate payment of invoices, Consultants shall execute the City's standard ACH Vendor Payment Authorization Agreement.

Upon verification of the data provided, the Payment Authorization Agreement will authorize the City to deposit payment for services rendered directly into Consultant accounts with financial institutions. All payments shall be in United States currency.
