Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- The purpose of this legislation is to accept and appropriate a grant agreement between the State of Oregon acting through the Oregon Military Department, Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and the City of Portland (SUBRECIPIENT), for federal disaster relief funding for public assistance, for damages caused by the December 6 23, 2015 Severe Winter Storms.
- There has been no previous Council action directly related to this legislation.
- This legislation does not support or change any specific City policy.

- **Budget impacts** This agreement will increase the budget for the bureaus making claims; however, since only 75% of eligible costs will be reimbursed, 25% of eligible costs will have to be provided from the bureaus' general funds.
- Change in expenses At the time of this agreement no final dollar figure has been committed to. Financial commitments will be made as Project Worksheets reported through the Damage Assessment Tool are authorized by state and federal officials.

For this legislation to get to this point, it required a significant effort on the part of the Principal Grants Management Analyst within the Office of Management and Finance, who is tasked with coordinating the City's response with Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), in addition to the work done by the bureaus that experienced damage caused by the Severe Winter Storms.
