Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The purpose of this ordinance is adopt Administrative Rules for Chapter 23.10 Removing Barriers to Employment and authorize the City Attorney to enter into a contract with the Bureau of Labor and Industry (BOLI) for its enforcement.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

Funds were allocated in the FY 2015-16 Budget, and then carried over to the FY 2016-17, for contracting with BOLI. Additionally, once the administrative rules have been adopted, the City Attorney will be using those funds for training and outreach to Portland business, prior to the effective date.

Community impacts and community involvement:

The rules were posted on the City Attorney's website on April 11, 2016, with a 21-day window for the public to provide comments in writing. Additionally, the Mayor's Office and the City's Attorney's Office hosted a public meeting on the rules on April 19, 2016.

Along with the general public, staff from the Mayor's Office and City Attorney's Office met separately with BOLI, the Portland Business Alliance, Venture Portland, Hispanic Metropolitan Chamber, the Urban League, and AFL-CIO Oregon to review the rules.

The Mayor's Office proposes the following amendments:

- In RBE 3.04 Civil Penalties, amend to include the following:
 - In addition to the remedies provided under ORS 659A.820 through 659A.865, if the City brings an action against an Employer who has demonstrated a pattern and practice of violating the Ordinance, the BOLI Commissioner may assess a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 for each violation of the Ordinance or these Rules.
 - 2. Any civil penalties assessed by the BOLI Commissioner under this section shall be payable directly to the City.
