

ORDINANCE No. 187814

*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University for the Springwater Corridor project, for an amount not to exceed \$54,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Springwater Corridor comprises the southeast segment of the 40-mile loop regional trail system encircling the great Portland area. Generally a family-friendly trail, the Springwater Corridor follows the banks of the Willamette River from downtown Portland to Johnson Creek through neighborhoods, industrial districts, parks refuges, and wet lands.
2. Over the past years, the multi-use trail for cyclists, joggers, and walkers that connects Boring to downtown Portland has seen an increase in homeless camps and nefarious activities in sections along the trail.
3. It is in the best interests of the citizens of Portland to identify issues, hear from various stakeholders and ultimately develop solutions working through the Oregon Consensus Project.
4. The City of Portland is interested in being a part of the process of convening a facilitated review of all relevant jurisdictions and stakeholders and run a process that results in tangible solutions for the Corridor itself.
5. The City desires to obtain such services from Portland State University.
6. Funds have been allocated from FY 15-16 Adopted Budget in Special Appropriations (\$40,000) and the Office of the Commissioner of Public Utilities (\$14,000).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Mayor is authorized to sign the attached Agreement, substantially in accordance with the original of this ordinance and, by reference, made a part hereof.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to draw and deliver payment to Portland State University in the amount of \$54,000 as specified in the Agreement, chargeable to the FY 2015-16 Adopted Budget and as authorized by City Council.


