ORDINANCE No. 187814

*Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University for the Springwater Corridor project, for an amount not to exceed \$54,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Springwater Corridor comprises the southeast segment of the 40-mile loop regional trail system encircling the great Portland area. Generally a family-friendly trail, the Springwater Corridor follows the banks of the Willamette River from downtown Portland to Johnson Creek through neighborhoods, industrial districts, parks refuges, and wet lands.
- Over the past years, the multi-use trail for cyclists, joggers, and walkers that connects 2. Boring to downtown Portland has seen an increase in homeless camps and nefarious activities in sections along the trail.
- 3. It is in the best interests of the citizens of Portland to identify issues, hear from various stakeholders and ultimately develop solutions working through the Oregon Consensus Project.
- The City of Portland is interested in being a part of the process of convening a facilitated 4. review of all relevant jurisdictions and stakeholders and run a process that results in tangible solutions for the Corridor itself.
- 5. The City desires to obtain such services from Portland State University.
- 6. Funds have been allocated from FY 15-16 Adopted Budget in Special Appropriations (\$40,000) and the Office of the Commissioner of Public Utilities (\$14,000).

NOW, THERFORE, the Council directs:

- That the Mayor is authorized to sign the attached Agreement, substantially in accordance a. with the original of this ordinance and, by reference, made a part hereof.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to draw and deliver payment to Portland State University in the amount of \$54,000 as specified in the Agreement, chargeable to the FY 2015-16 Adopted Budget and as authorized by City Council.

The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding could Section 2. delay implementation project; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
