Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This amended report provides the official results of the Municipal Non-Partisan Primary election held May 17, 2016 in the City of Portland, with additional ballots reported by Clackamas County after original certification. The additional ballots represent no change in candidates elected, nominated, or measures passed.

City Code 2.08.120 requires the City Elections Officer to proclaim to the City Council the candidates nominated or elected and the measures approved at each City election.

City Code 2.04.090 requires calculation of a percentage of electors at each regular primary election to determine new petition signature minimums. These numbers are included on the report and are not affected by additional ballots reported.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This report has no financial or budgetary impacts.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Except for the election itself, elections results typically have no public involvement component. The results, along with the abstract of votes and amendment to the abstract of votes, will be posted on the elections website of the City Auditor.
