

# ORDINANCE No. 187894

Authorize grant agreements or Intergovernmental Agreements with thirteen community groups and native plant mini grants related to the Community Watershed Stewardship Program up to \$100,000 total (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland City Council adopted the Clean River Program on April 6, 1990. In 1995, the Bureau of Environmental Services developed the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (CWSP) to provide grant funds and technical assistance for citizen-led watershed projects. On March 8, 2006, the Council adopted the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan which describes actions for watershed health including citizen led activities such as natural area revegetation, education, involvement and stewardship.
2. These grants have been selected for FY 16-17: Lower Columbia Estuary Partnership - Vernon Elementary Stormwater Project (\$8,999); Sabin Community Development - Youth Opportunities (\$6,000); Depave - Greening Bridgeport United Church of Christ (\$10,000); Bridger PTA - Bridger Rain Garden and Outdoor Classroom (\$6,870); ROSE Community Development - Lents Youth Initiative Pollinator Habitat Enhancement (\$7,100); PSU Indigenous Nations Studies/NAYA - Kah San Chako Haws First Foods Garden (\$10,000); Johnson Creek Watershed Council - Creek Clean Up (\$5,500); National Indian Parent Information Center / Johnson Creek Watershed Council- Native American Youth for the Environment (\$7,040); Linnton Community Center - Shipping Container Ecoroof and Vertical Gardens (\$5,715); Linnton Neighborhood Association / Neighbors West-Northwest- Kingsley Community Garden (\$7,000); Tryon Creek Watershed Council -Watershed Restoration Mentors (\$10,000); Mecha Statewide / Groundwork Portland - Latino Youth Stormwater Microfiltration Study (\$6,856) and City Repair - Pollinator Pathways (\$7,000). Additionally \$2,150 will be spent on native plant mini grants to be awarded to community groups for planting events throughout the year.
3. The established cost is \$100,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 16-17 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, ESWS000007

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute grant agreements and intergovernmental agreements for the purpose described in Section 1, in substantially the same forms as Exhibits A and B attached herein, in the amount of \$100,000.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.



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
