Vector Control Services Needed

- Rats living in the sewers leave the pipes from street inlets and service branches
- BES owns over 180
 stormwater quality sites
 requiring mosquito
 treatment and monitoring







Vector Control Service Provider

- County has been providing health services to City since 1968
- The County has been providing BES vector control services through multi-year Intergovernmental Agreements.
- Program Highlights
 - Rodent Control and Surveillance program
 - Mosquito Control and Surveillance program
 - Vector control education and public outreach
 - Emerging issues

New IGA

- Reimbursement based on actual services performed (fullyburdened hourly rate)
- Billing rates will be adjusted annually if necessary
- Reporting of data and metrics spatially
- Commitment to develop performance measures, benchmarking, and identify opportunities for improving efficiency



Program Budget & Schedule

- \$277,000 for FY17
- IGA will go into effect immediately
