* Accept and appropriate a grant in the amount of \$125,000 and authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Department of Transportation, Transportation Safety Division, for the 2016 Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program for motor carrier safety inspections by the Police Bureau Traffic sworn personnel (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Transportation Safety Division has notified the City that it will award a grant for the 2016 Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) to the Police Bureau in the amount of \$125,000; and
- 2. The Police Bureau Traffic Division will conduct inspections as part of the commercial motor carrier safety inspection program that started in 1982; and
- 3. ODOT will reimburse the City a maximum of \$125,000 to enforce motor carrier safety regulations in mutually agreed upon highway locations worked on the 2016 Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program through June 30, 2017; and
- 4. ODOT will reimburse the City at a rate of \$113.75 per Qualifying Safety Stop (QSS); and
- 5. No local match is required by the grant; and
- 6. The Council declares that an emergency exists due to critical dates in the project timeline as required by the grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City a grant from ODOT for the 2016 Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program in the amount of \$125,000.
- b. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with ODOT acting by and through its Motor Carrier Enforcement Program substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- c. The FY 2016-17 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Fund - 217

Business Area - PL

Bureau Program Expenses - \$125,000

- d. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- e. The Chief of the Police Bureau of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by ODOT for the 2016 Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program Grant, ODOT Agreement #31582, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would jeopardize the awarding of the grant funds from ODOT. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
