## **ORDINANCE** No.

\* Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University in the amount of \$34,020 to conduct a study of mental health workers perspectives on police interactions and provide training program evaluation, review, and consulting (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In 2013, the Portland Police Bureau began the Enhanced Crisis Intervention Team (ECIT) training to train a select group of volunteer officers to assist with specific calls involving a behavioral health crisis.
- 2. The ECIT training is based on partnering with the mental health system and supporting police and community member interactions that result in the safest possible outcome for officers and community members.
- 3. ECIT trainings enhance officers' skills, expand their knowledge base, and increase their confidence in managing situations involving a behavioral health crisis.
- 4. A portion of the ECIT training evaluation process is to measure officers' effectiveness interacting with persons with mental illness, as well as their level of success interacting with mental health facilities.
- 5. This study will collect feedback from Project Respond workers and other mental health providers utilizing a combination of interview and survey methodology.
- 6. The Police Bureau Training Division will utilize this information to support the ECIT training evaluation process and the Police Bureau Behavioral Health Unit will utilize this information as a part of their performance measurements.
- 7. Sufficient funding resides in existing FY 2016-17 Police Bureau appropriation.
- 8. It is beneficial to the City and community that this agreement may be authorized as quickly as possible to avoid a lapse in the program.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. That the Commissioner-in-charge is authorized to execute an agreement between the City and Portland State University as outlined in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$34,020.
- b. The Mayor and the Auditor hereby are authorized to pay for the contract from the FY 2016-17 Budget.

c. The Chief of Police and the Project Manager are authorized to execute amendments to the scope of services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the amount of compensation or increase the City's financial risk.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in proceeding with this agreement will delay the completion of the Police Bureau's training evaluation. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
