ORDINANCE No. 187964

* Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice for \$30,000 for the Portland Police Bureau to participate in the NIJ Real-time Crime Forecasting Challenge (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Law enforcement agencies across the U.S. use a variety of off-the-shelf computerized crime mapping programs to guide decision making in areas such as resource allocation;
- 2. The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, National Institute of Justice (NIJ) has released the Real-time Crime Forecasting Challenge to perform an unbiased, comprehensive comparative analysis of how the different products perform relative to one another. The main goals of this project are to foster innovation by involving non-traditional crime forecasting participants and provide a mechanism to compare available methods;
- 3. The NIJ has selected the Portland Police Bureau to take part in this challenge by providing the calls-for-service (CFS) data that will be used for the challenge;
- 4. The data set will only include call data which is not sensitive in nature (e.g. domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, where addresses are specific to individual victims);
- 5. PPB will provide an NIJ contractor acting on behalf of the NIJ all CFS data that occurs between March 1, 2012 and May 31, 2017;
- 6. The data deliverables will be submitted between September 1, 2016 and June 7, 2017;
- 7. The Portland Police Bureau and NIJ wish to enter into an agreement; and
- 8. The Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) will allow the NIJ to reimburse the City for administrative cost recovery expenses not to exceed \$30,000;
- 9. Council declares that an emergency exists because the agreed upon start of this challenge is September 1, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute an agreement in a form similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Chief of the City of Portland Police Bureau is authorized to accept subsequent modifications by NIJ to the IGA, provided such modifications do not increase the City's

financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because of critical deadlines in the data set delivery schedule and the program timeline. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


