Ordinance No.10190

An Ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No.8765, entitled, "An Ordinance regulating hawkers and peddlers of berries, groceries, vegetables and fruit" as amended by Ordinance No.9539. 7/0/90

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No.8765, entitled, "An Ordinance regulating hawkers and peddlers of berries, groceries, vegetables and fruit" as amended by Ordinance No.9539, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Hawkers or peddlers of berries, vegetables, fruit, butter, lard, eggs, cheese, brooms, nuts or canned goods, from vehicles or baskets shall be classified and pay license as follows:

When traveling with one or more animals, the first class; When traveling on foot, the second class.

Hawkers or peddlers of the first class shall pay a quarterly license of Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars.

Hawkers or peddlers of the second class shall pay a quarterly license of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

The first classification herein shall not be so construed as to include more than two persons with each vehicle, animal or animals.
