ORDINANCE No.

*Accept and appropriate a grant from the Federal Highway Bridge Program in the amount of \$2,512,440 and authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Oregon Department of Transportation to replace the SE 122nd Avenue Bridge over Johnson Creek (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The weatherworn timber bridge that carries public traffic on SE 122nd Avenue over Johnson Creek in the Pleasant Valley Neighborhood was significantly damaged by the record-breaking storms in December of 2015; and
- 2. The storm-damaged bridge was closed to all motorized vehicular traffic on February 3, 2016, and remains so;
- 3. The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) applied to the Federal Highway Bridge Program for a grant in the amount of \$2,512,440 for the replacement of the SE 122nd Avenue Bridge over Johnson Creek (51C20) on February 22, 2016;
- 4. The Federal Highway Administration, acting through its Agent, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), has notified the City of Portland that it will award a grant for the replacement of the SE 122nd Avenue Bridge over Johnson Creek (51C20) to the Bureau of Transportation in the amount of \$2,512,440;
- 5. The total project cost is estimated to be \$2,800,000, of which \$2,512,440 will be Federal Highway Bridge Program funding and \$287,560 will be local City match;
- 6. The Bureau's level of confidence of the cost estimate for this project is low because only limited technical information is available at this time and project design is yet to commence.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from the Federal Highway Bridge Program for the replacement of the SE 122nd Avenue Bridge over Johnson Creek (51C20) in the amount of \$2,512,440 and to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement in a form similar to the contract attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The FY 2016 /2017 budget is hereby amended as follows

c. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute amendments, approved as to

form by the City Attorney, to the scope of the services or the terms and conditions of this Agreement, provided the changes do not increase the City's financial risk. Increases to the grant amount must be approved by the City Council.

d. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Commissioner-in-Charge's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
