Authorize the City Attorney's Office to take all necessary legal steps, including initiation of legal proceedings, to bring a declaratory judgment action under ORS 28.020 and 33.710 and any other causes of action regarding the impact of Charter Changes, Fire & Police Disability & Retirement Board Resolutions, state statutes and other law on Fire & Police Disability & Retirement benefits (Resolution)

WHEREAS, in pertinent part, the legal proceedings shall seek to obtain a declaration that the legislature, in adopting ORS 237.620(2), intended to place the City of Portland's retirement system for fire fighters and police officers on equal footing with the State of Oregon's Public Employee Retirement System (PERS) and as such, retirement benefits for police and fire fighters are prohibited subjects of bargaining; and

WHEREAS, in November of 2006, Portland voters approved substantial reforms to both the disability and pension systems of the Fire & Police Disability, Retirement, and Death Benefit Plan ("FPDR"), including changing the composition of the FPDR Board of Trustees so a majority of the Board no longer is comprised of FPDR beneficiaries; and

WHEREAS, in November of 2012, Portland voters approved Ballot Measure 26-145, which amended Section 5-303 of the Portland City Charter and reformed the FPDR disability and pension systems; and

WHERAS, the 2012 voter-approved amendments changed the definition of "final pay" from "the highest base pay received by the FPDR Two members during any of the three consecutive twelve month periods preceding the month in which the FPDR member retires" to "the highest base pay received by the FPDR Two members for any of the three consecutive 365-day or 366-day in a leap year, period"; and

WHEREAS, the Portland City Council referred the FPDR reforms to the voters to help create greater accountability to the taxpayers of the City of Portland and to help ensure the future stability and financial soundness of the FPDR fund, City's finances and fairness to future generations of taxpayers in the City of Portland; and

WHEREAS, FPDR members and the police and fire labor unions have filed lawsuits, union grievances and/or unfair labor practices ("legal challenges") contesting the voter-approved reforms to the FPDR system and FPDR Board decisions; and

WHEREAS, these legal challenges threaten to undermine the authority of the FPDR Board of Trustees to interpret and administer the FPDR system, to implement rules, regulations and resolutions consistent with the terms of the City of Portland Charter; and threaten to undermine the stability and integrity of the FPDR system; and

WHEREAS, the legal challenges contend that the voter-approved Charter changes to FPDR and decisions made by the FPDR Board of Trustees are mandatory subjects of bargaining; and

WHEREAS, these legal challenges involve significant amounts of money, potentially impact the financial soundness and viability of the FPDR fund, and may impact the General Fund; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Attorney or her designee, whether through the City Attorney's Office or through counsel specially employed for that purpose, is authorized to take all necessary legal steps, including initiation of legal proceedings, to bring a declaratory judgment action under ORS 28.020 and 33.710 and any other causes of action regarding the impact of Charter Changes, FPDR Board Resolutions, state statutes, and other law on FPDR benefits. In pertinent part, the legal proceedings shall seek to obtain a declaration that the legislature, in adopting ORS 237.620(2), intended to place the City of Portland's retirement system for fire fighters and police officers on equal footing with the State of Oregon's Public Employee Retirement System (PERS) and as such, retirement benefits for police and fire fighters are prohibited subjects of bargaining.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this resolution is binding City policy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, nothing in this Resolution shall prevent the Commissioner in Charge of the Police or Fire Bureaus, upon consultation with the City Attorney, from taking action to mitigate damages in these matters;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, nothing in this Resolution shall prevent the City Attorney's Office from continuing to defend any other legal challenges.
