Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The Development Review Advisory Committee (DRAC) is a citizen advisory body representing those with interests in the outcome of policies, budgets, regulations, and procedures that affect development review processes. The DRAC is composed of 17 members representing different stakeholder groups, such as builders, developers, designers, and neighborhoods.

Portland City Code Title 3.30.030 specifies that members of the DRAC may serve up to two 3year terms. Current DRAC members Christopher Kopca and Kirk Olsen have completed their first terms and are eligible for reappointment. In addition, after a thorough review process, Jeff Bachrach is recommended for appointment to a vacant DRAC position for a 3-year term.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This legislation appoints a citizen volunteer to serve on the DRAC, and will therefore have no budgetary or long-term financial impacts for the Bureau of Development Services (BDS) or the City.

Community impacts and community involvement:

This legislation will benefit the development review process and the community by supporting the continued effective functioning of the DRAC. Each of the 17 members of the DRAC represents a unique stakeholder group to the development review process; making the member appointment specified in this legislation will ensure that the member's stakeholder group will be represented.

Public notice regarding the vacant DRAC position being filled through this legislation was provided in multiple issues of BDS's *Plans Examiner* newsletter. The *Plans Examiner* is widely distributed electronically to BDS customers and stakeholders, as well as neighborhood associations and community groups. Notice was also provided on the DRAC webpage on BDS's website. In addition, current DRAC members notified their stakeholder groups of the vacant position.

With this appointment, two vacant DRAC positions will remain. BDS is conducting outreach to fill these positions.

Two current DRAC members have completed their first terms and are eligible for reappointment. They have expressed interest in continuing to serve on the DRAC. In addition, after a thorough review process, I am recommending Jeff Bachrach for appointment to the vacant Planning & Sustainability DRAC category for a 3-year term.

Christopher Kopca and Kirk Olsen have proven to be valuable contributors to the DRAC and its work during their first terms. Their experiences and perspectives have greatly aided efforts to streamline and improve the development review process. I am therefore recommending that they be reappointed to represent their respective categories for a second 3-year term as indicated.

Mr. Bachrach is a land-use and real estate attorney in the Portland area, who is also well-known as an advocate for affordable housing. He served nine years on the Board of Commissioners of the Housing Authority of Portland, and is a former board member of REACH Community Development Corporation and the Home Builders Association of Metropolitan Portland. In addition to serving on the Planning & Sustainability Commission, he is a member of Central City Concern's Real Estate Committee and is the principal of Bachrach. Law, P.C. His experience with large master-planned communities, knowledge of Oregon's land use system and passion for providing affordable housing in Portland will make him a valuable member of the DRAC.

I am recommending that Jeff be appointed to a 3-year term on the DRAC as indicated.

With these proposed appointments, two vacant positions (Environmental Conservation & Green Building and Small Businesses) would remain on the DRAC. I have enclosed an updated DRAC membership list for your records.

These appointments will help to ensure the continuation of the good work of the DRAC on behalf of BDS and other City bureaus, the development industry, and the community.

Development Review Advisory Committee:

The Development Review Advisory Committee (DRAC) is a citizen advisory body, representing those with interests in the outcome of policies, budgets, regulations, and procedures that affect development review processes. The purpose of the Committee is to foster a timely, predictable and accountable development review process that implements the City's goals for land use, transportation, housing, economic development, neighborhood livability and the environment. The Committee advocates for and supports consistent and fair application and implementation of regulations.

The Development Review Advisory Committee consists of seventeen members. These members are appointed by the Commissioner-in-Charge and confirmed by the City Council. The members are elected to provide representation of those persons concerned about planning, design and development. The areas of interest of members shall include, but not be limited to, development, planning, construction contracting, design professions, neighborhood association membership, business association membership, historic preservation, environmental organizations, and institutional properties. Members of the Development Review Advisory Committee shall serve no more than two, complete three-year terms.

The DRAC meetings are held the third Thursday of each month from 8:00 to 9:30 a.m.
