# ORDINANCE NO. 187993

\*Authorize application to the Metro for grants in the amount of up to \$1 million to the Regional Travel Options grant for the SmartTrips Program (Ordinance)

### The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Through the Regional Travel Options (RTO) grant process, the Metro Regional Government is soliciting proposals for federal transportation funding that will be available between 2017 and 2019.
- 2. There is approximately \$2.5 million available region-wide for Travel options projects that create safe, vibrant and livable communities by increasing the use and understanding of travel options.
- 3. Working with stakeholders, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) request to submit a grant application for transportation demand management, also known at PBOT's SmartTrips Program.
- 4. The SmartTrips individualized program is proven to be an effective transportation demand management tool. In 2014 and 2015, the program garnered a 7.4% reduction in drive alone trips and an increase of 6.2% in active transportation.
- 5. PBOT plans request fund to continue our individualized marketing program, which currently works in underserved communities, while also incorporating components of the Smart City initiative into our future program.
- 6. Local match of at least 10.27% will be provided from the Bureau of Transportation.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Director of Transportation is hereby authorized to make application to Metro for grant for up to \$1 million and to document City Council support in the required projects nomination letter.
- b. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Transportation is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Commissioner-in-Charge's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the grant applications are due immediately; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
