Legislation title: * Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon State Police to

provide the Portland Police Bureau access to Oregon State Police's

Automated Biometric Identification System (Ordinance)

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Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

Oregon State Police (OSP) will allow the City of Portland Police Bureau's Forensic Evidence Division access to OSP's Automated Biometric Identification System (ABIS). The agreement is limited to the Western Identification Network, Inc. (WIN) ABIS fingerprint and palm print image, data record, and respective minutiae data reading, digitizing, matching, and storing and retrieval services.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

The maximum, not-to-exceed compensation payable to OSP by the City under the Intergovernmental Agreement, which includes any allowable expenses, is \$36,100.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Portland Police access to these systems is crucial to recording and identifying the more than 35,000 individuals arrested each year. The latent print database is used to investigate crimes such as burglary, robbery, theft and homicide.
