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ORDINANCE No.

*Authorize contract with Johns Hopkins University for technical consulting assistance as part of the Bloomberg Philanthropies What Works Cities initiative (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Mayor and Commissioners collectively expressed interest in participating in the Bloomberg Philanthropies "What Works Cities" initiative (WWC) in a letter of support dated February 26th, 2016, whereby municipalities may obtain technical assistance to enhance the use of data and evidence to support citizen engagement, make government more effective, and improve the lives of residents.
2. WWC notified the City that Portland has been selected for the initiative, and provided a Statement of Work that contained scope of work to be accomplished by the City in partnership with the technical support and expertise of the Center for Government Excellence, an entity of Johns Hopkins University, at no financial cost for the City.
3. Johns Hopkins University has agreed to provide the City with technical assistance in the WWC project as described in a Memorandum of Understanding. The City through lead coordination of the City Budget Office will coordinate with appropriate City bureau teams necessary for project success.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the City Budget Office, or designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding, in a form substantially similar to Exhibit A attached hereto and as approved to form by the City Attorney, with Johns Hopkins University for the implementation of What Works Cities technical assistance. The Director of the City Budget Office, or designee, is further authorized to execute written amendments to the scope of work or terms and conditions of the agreement, provided any amended agreement is approved to form by the City Attorney and the changes do not increase the financial risk or impose greater liability on the City.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
