

RESOLUTION No. 37256

Authorize the Portland Bureau of Transportation to develop a Transportation System Development Charge methodology based upon the “Person Trip” model to more accurately reflect Portland’s Transportation System (Resolution)

WHEREAS, The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) is updating its Transportation System Development Charge (TSDC) for the third time consistent with a ten year cycle; and

WHEREAS, During both PBOT’s adoption of a TSDC in 1997 and the update of its TSDC in 2007, PBOT used the ITE Manual as a basis for determinations of trip generation for new development; and

WHEREAS, PBOT and PSU evaluated the current TSDC methodology and determined that a “person trip” model could more accurately reflect Portland’s multi-modal characteristics; and

WHEREAS, Several jurisdictions around the nation are adopting “person trips” as a basis for impact fees like TSDCs; and

WHEREAS, A “person trip” model corrects some disparities with the treatment of different modes of transportation under the current TSDC methodology; and

WHEREAS, PBOT will also propose elements of the update for dense urban areas to show that pedestrian, bicycle, and transit trips that support the Comprehensive Plan and Climate Change Goals also have a very different impact from Single Occupancy Vehicle trips; and

WHEREAS, Over the next six months, PBOT will be updating the methodology, refining a new project list, and developing an appropriate rate that keeps affordability in mind; and

WHEREAS, PBOT will be returning to City Council before the end of the fiscal year after outreach and ORS mandated notification timelines for the TSDC Rate Study with the entire package for adoption with the new fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, PBOT is seeking authorization to pursue a “person trip” methodology with the new update.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Portland City Council authorizes PBOT to utilize a “person trip” methodology to better reflect the multi-modal characteristics of Portland in its Transportation System Development Charge update; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City Council directs PBOT to return to City Council with an evaluation of the success and challenges of the “person trip” model within one year of adoption including performance metrics and any adjustments, if necessary, to the model.
